### **UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE MEASURES, AS AT JULY 10, 2021**

#### **PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **536** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,036** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **8.9%**. From the cases **518** are Kenyans while **18** are foreigners. **274** are males and **262** females. The youngest is a **four-month-old infant** while the oldest is **90** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **188,513** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,012,698**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **186**, Busia **50**, Uasin Gishu **39**, Nakuru **30**, Nyeri **22**, Mombasa **19**, Taita Taveta **18**,

Nandi **17**, Kericho **16**, Siaya **15**, Migori **12**, Kisumu **12**, Kilifi **11**, Laikipia **10**, Nyamira **9**, Kajiado **8**, Kiambu **7**, Vihiga **6**, Nyandarua **5**, Kakamega **5**, Turkana **5**, Baringo **4**, Bungoma **4**, Tana River **4**, Murang'a **4**, Bomet **3**, Homa Bay **3**, Embu **2**, Kirinyaga **2**, Kwale **2**, Machakos **2**, Narok **1**, Tharaka Nithi **1**, Garissa **1** and Kitui **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**21**), 10-19 years (**29**), 20-29 years (**110**), 30-39 (**128**) 40-49 (**104**) 50-59 (**59**) 60 years and above (**85**).

Today **336** patients have recovered from the disease with **236** from various health facilities countrywide while **100** are from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. Total recoveries now stand at **178,119** out of whom **141,958** are from the Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **36,161** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **3** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in July 2021. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **3,721**. Our sincere condolences to all who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(3)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(56)**, 10-19 years **(26)**, 20-29 **(119)**, 30-39 years **(307)**, 40-49 years **(443)**, 50-59 years **(751)**, 60 years and above **(2,019)**.

A total of **1,092** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **3,982** are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **120** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **39** of whom are on ventilatory support and **61** on supplemental oxygen. **20** patients are under observation.

Another **202** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **184** of them in general wards and **18** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

**VACCINATION:** As of today, a total of **1,538,340** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **1,026,820** while second doses are **511,520**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first

dose is at **49.8%** with the majority being males at **55%** while females are at **45%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is **2.0%**.

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows: Health Workers **97,955**, Aged 58 years and above **158,123**, Others **144,437**, Teachers **70,561** while Security Officers are at **40,444**.
