**UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE
MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 10, 2021**

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **624** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,728** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **9.3%**. From the cases **567** are Kenyans while **57** are foreigners. **405** are males and **219** females. The youngest is a **two-month-old infant** while the oldest is **94** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **174,285** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,852,612**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **152**, Kisumu **70**, Busia **58**, Mombasa **47**, Uasin Gishu **38**, Kisii **33**, Bungoma **31**, Homa Bay **25**, Kakamega **19**, Siaya **18**, Nakuru **15**, Kiambu **15**, Bomet **15**, Migori **13**, Vihiga **12**, Kericho **8**, Nyamira **7**, Kilifi **7**, Trans Nzoia **7**, Tharaka Nithi **6**, Kirinyaga **4**, Nandi **3**, Machakos **3**, Murang'a **2**, Narok **2**, Nyeri **2**, Kajiado **2**, Kitui **1**, Kwale **1**, Laikipia **1**, Baringo **1**, Elgeyo Marakwet **1**, Marsabit **1**, Meru **1**, Embu **1**, Garissa **1** and Isiolo **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **152** cases are from Starehe (22), Kamukunji (16), Makadara and Embakasi West (11) cases each, Dagoretti North and Ruaraka (10) cases each, Langata, Roysambu and Westlands (9) cases each, Embakasi East (8), Embakasi North, Embakasi South, Kasarani, Kibra and Mathare (6) cases each, Embakasi Central (4), Dagoretti South (3). In **Kisumu** the **70** cases are from Kisumu Central (37), Kisumu East (18), Kisumu West (5), Muhoroni (4), Nyando (3), Seme (2), Nyakach (1).

In **Busia** the **58** cases are from Matayos (33), Teso North (19), Teso South (5), Samia (1). In **Mombasa** the **47** cases are from Mvita (24), Nyali (13), Kisauni (4), Changamwe, Jomvu and Likoni (2) cases each. In **Uasin Gishu** the **38** cases are from Moiben

(30), Ainabkoi (4), Kapseret and Soy (2) cases each. In **Kisii** the **33** cases are from Kitutu Chache South (13), Nyaribari Chache (7), Bomachoge Chache (5), Bomachoge Borabu and South Mugirango (3) cases each, Bobasi and Bonchari (1) case each.

In **Bungoma** the **31** cases are from Kanduyi (20), Cheptais and Tongaren (3) cases each, Mt Elgon (2), Bumula, Sirisia and Webuye East (1) case each. In **Homa Bay** the **25** cases are from Homa Bay Town (13), Karachuonyo (4), Rachuonyo South (3), Kabondo Kasipul and Ndhiwa (2) cases each, Rangwe (1). In **Kiambu** the **15** cases are from Thika (5), Kiambu Town (3), Kabete, Kiambaa and Ruiru (2) cases each, Juja (1).

In **Bomet** the **15** cases are from Konoin (7), Bomet Central and Bomet East (3) cases each, Chepalungu and Sotik (1) case each.

In **Kakamega** the **19** cases are from Lurambi (5), Mumias East (4), Khwisero (3), Mumias West (2), Butere, Ikolomani, Malava, Matungu and Turbo (1) case each. In **Siaya** the **18** cases are from Rarieda (6), Ugenya (5), Ugunja (4), Bondo (2), Alego-Usonga (1).

In **Nakuru** the **15** cases are from Naivasha (7), Nakuru West (4), Nakuru East (3), Njoro (1).

In **Migori** the **13** cases are from Suna East (9), Rongo (4).

In **Vihiga** the **12** cases are from Hamisi (5), Sabatia and Vihiga (3) cases each, Emuhaya (1). In **Kericho** the **8** cases are from

Belgut (6) and Ainamoi (2). In **Nyamira** the **7** cases are from Nyamira Town (3), Borabu and Masaba North (2) cases each. In **Kilifi** the **7** cases are from Magarini (4), Malindi (3). In **Trans Nzoia** the **7** cases are from Cherangany (3), Kiminini (2), Endebess and Kwanza (1) case each. In **Tharaka Nithi** the **6** cases are from Chuka (5), Tharaka South (1).

In **Kirinyaga** the **4** cases are from Kirinyaga Central (3), Mwea West (1). In **Nandi** the **3** cases are from Emgwen while in **Machakos** the **3** cases are from Athi River, Masinga and Matungulu (1) case each. The **2** cases in **Murang'a** are from Gatanga and Kandara (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Narok** are from Narok North, the **2** cases in **Nyeri** are from Nyeri Central and the **2** cases in **Kajiado** are from Kajiado East.

The **case** in **Kitui** is from Kitui East, the **case** in **Kwale** is from Msambweni, the **case** in **Laikipia** is from Laikipia East, the **case** in **Baringo** is from Baringo Central, the **case** in **Elgeyo Marakwet** is from Keiyo North, the **case** in **Marsabit** is from Saku, the **case** in **Meru** is from Imenti North, the **case** in **Embu** is from Runyenjes, the **case** in **Garissa** is from Dadaab and the **case** in **Isiolo** is from Isiolo Town.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(22)**, 10-19 years **(43)**, 20-29 years **(109)**, 30-39 **(161)** 40-49 **(116)** 50-59 **(87)** 60 years and above **(86)**.

Today **313** patients have recovered from the disease, **258** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **55** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **119,246** of whom **86,596** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **32,650** are from various health facilities.

Unfortunately, **17** people have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting Facility Record Audits on diverse dates in the month of May and June. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **3,362**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(2)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(5)**, 60 years and above **(9)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**55**), 10-19 years (**23**), 20-29 (**110**), 30-39 years (**275**), 40-49 years (**413**), 50-59 years (**697**), 60 years and above (**1,789**).

A total of **991** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **4,940** patients are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **111** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **31** of whom are on ventilatory support and **66** on supplemental oxygen. **14** patients are under observation.

Another **106** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **101** of them in general wards and **5** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION:

As of today, a total of **1,059,117** vaccines have so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **982,310** while total 2nd doses are **76,807**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **7.82%** with the majority being males at **57%** while females are at **43%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is **less than 1%**.

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows; Health Workers **25,430**, Aged 58 years and above **19,721**, Others **19,074**, Teachers **7,545** while Security Officers **5,037**.
