**UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE  
MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 12, 2021**

**PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **403** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,577** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **7.2%**. From the cases **399** are Kenyans except **4** that are foreigners. **215** are males and **188** females. The youngest is **a one-year-old baby** while the oldest is **97** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **175,176** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,864,020**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **47**, Kisii **34**, Kericho **33**, Nyeri **31**, Siaya **31**, Kisumu **29**, Mombasa **27**, Nakuru **22**, Homa Bay **21**, Migori **18**, Nyamira **17**, Bomet **15**, Busia **13**, Kakamega **8**, Baringo **7**, Trans Nzoia **6**, Uasin Gishu **6**, Kiambu **5**, Vihiga **5**, Bungoma **4**, Kirinyaga **4**, Murang'a **2**, Embu **2**, Narok **2**, West Pokot **2**, Kajiado **2**, Kilifi **2**, Laikipia **2**, Machakos **1**, Meru **1**, Nandi **1**, Garissa **1**, Kitui **1** and Kwale **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **47** cases are from Starehe (6), Langata (5), Dagoretti North, Embakasi Central and Embakasi West (4) cases each, Dagoretti South, Embakasi South and Kibra (3) cases each, Embakasi East, Embakasi North, Kamukunji, Makadara, Mathare and Westlands (2) cases each, Kasarani, Roysambu and Ruaraka (1) case each. In **Kisii** the **34** cases are from Kitutu Chache South (15), Nyaribari Chache (7), Bobasi and Kitutu Chache North (3) cases each, Bomachoge Chache (2), Bomachoge Borabu, Bonchari, Masaba North and South Mugirango (1) case each.

In **Kericho** the **33** cases are from Ainamoi (23), Belgut and Bureti (4) cases each, Kipkelion East and Sigowet/Soin (1) case each. In **Nyeri** the **31** cases are from Nyeri Central (18), Mathira East and Nyeri South (4) cases each, Tetu (3), Mukurweini (2). In **Siaya** the

**31** cases are from Alego-Usonga (12), Rarieda and Ugunja (6) cases each, Bondo (3), Gem and Ugenya (2) cases each. In **Kisumu** the **29** cases are from Kisumu Central (16), Kisumu East, Kisumu West, Nyakach and Seme (3) cases each, Nyando (1).

In **Mombasa** the **27** cases are from Mvita (9), Jomvu (8), Nyali (5), Changamwe (3), Kisauni and Likoni (1) case each. In **Nakuru** the **22** cases are from Nakuru West (10), Naivasha and Nakuru East (4) cases each, Kuresoi South, Molo, Nakuru North and Rongai (1) case each. In **Homa Bay** the **21** cases are from Homa Bay Town (8), Karachuonyo, Ndhiwa and Suba North (3) cases each, Kabondo Kasipul (2), Mbita and Rachuonyo South (1) case each.

In **Migori** the **18** cases are from Suna East (9), Rongo (7), Kuria West and Uriri (1) case each. In **Nyamira** the **17** cases are from Nyamira Town (12), Borabu (2), Manga, Masaba North and Nyamira North (1) case each. In **Bomet** the **15** cases are from Bomet Central (7), Konoin and Sotik (4) cases each. In **Busia** the **13** cases are from Matayos and Teso South (4) cases each, Samia (2), Bunyala, Butula and Teso North (1) case each.

In **Kakamega** the **8** cases are from Shinyalu (3), Lurambi (2), Butere, Likuyani and Mumias East (1) case each. In **Baringo** the **7** cases are from Koibatek (4), Baringo Central (3). In **Trans Nzoia** the **6** cases are from Endebess and Kiminini (2) cases each,

Cherangany and Saboti (1) case each. In **Uasin Gishu** the **6** cases are from Ainabkoi and Kapseret (2) cases each, Kesses and Turbo (1) case each.

In **Kiambu** the **5** cases are from Kiambaa and Ruiru (2) cases each, Kikuyu (1). In **Vihiga** the **5** cases are from Sabatia and Vihiga (2) cases each, Luanda (1). In **Bungoma** the **4** cases are from Kimilili (2), Tongaren and Webuye West (1) case each. In **Kirinyaga** the **4** cases are from Kirinyaga Central (3), Mwea West (1).

The **2** cases in **Murang'a** are from Gatanga and Kandara (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Embu** are from Manyatta and Mbeere South (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Narok** are from Narok North, the **2** cases in **West Pokot** are from Pokot South and West Pokot (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Kajiado** are from Kajiado North, the **2** cases in **Kilifi** are from **Malindi** and the **2** cases in **Laikipia** are from Laikipia East and West (1) case each.

The **case** in **Machakos** is from Machakos Town, the **case** in **Meru** is from Imenti North, the **case** in **Nandi** is from Tinderet, the **case** in **Garissa** is from Balambala, the **case** in **Kitui** is from Mwingi Central and the **case** in **Kwale** is from Kinango.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(15)**, 10-19 years **(15)**, 20-29 years **(68)**, 30-39 **(98)** 40-49 **(70)** 50-59 **(68)** 60 years and above **(69)**.

Today **442** patients have recovered from the disease, **418** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **24** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **120,031** of whom **87,288** are from the Home Based Care and Isolation Program, while **32,743** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **18** people have succumbed to the disease, **one** of them having occurred in the last 24 hours, while **17** are late deaths reported after conducting Facility Record Audits on diverse dates in the months of May and June. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **3,396**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(1)**, 30-39 years **(1)**, 40-49 years **(2)**, 50-59 years **(4)**, 60 years and above **(10)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(55)**, 10-19 years **(23)**, 20-29 **(111)**, 30-39 years **(277)**, 40-49 years **(418)**, 50-59 years **(702)**, 60 years and above **(1,810)**.

A total of **957** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **4,796** patients are under Home Based Isolation and Care program. **163** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **30** of whom are on ventilatory support and **113** on supplemental oxygen. **20** patients are under observation.

Another **105** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **100** of them in general wards and **5** in High Dependency Units (HDU).
