UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE MEASURES, AS AT JULY 14, 2021

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **480** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,120** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **9.4%**. From the cases **459** are Kenyans while **21** are foreigners. **245** are males and **235** females. The youngest is a **two-month-old infant** while the oldest is **100** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **190,183** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,028,927**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **178**, Nakuru **54**, Kiambu **40**, Siaya **25**, Uasin Gishu **25**, Kisumu **20**, Nandi **19**, Kakamega **14**, Trans Nzoia **12**, Mombasa **11**, Kilifi **10**, Tharaka Nithi **8**, Kajiado **6**, Kericho **6**, Migori **5**, Embu **5**, Nyandarua **5**, Bungoma **4**, Meru **4**, Murang'a **4**, Garissa **3**, Kirinyaga **3**, Machakos **3**, Kwale **2**, Nyeri **2**, Taita Taveta **2**, Tana River **2**, Makueni **1**, Narok **1**, Baringo **1**, Busia **1**, Homa Bay **1**, Bomet **1**, Kitui **1** and Laikipia **1**.

In terms of Sub County distribution; the **178** cases in **Nairobi** are from Langata (19), Mathare (17), Dagoretti North (16), Embakasi Central and Westlands (15) cases each, Embakasi West (12), Makadara (11), Kibra and Starehe (10) cases each, Embakasi East and Roysambu (9) cases each, Dagoretti South (8), Kamukunji (7), Embakasi South and Ruaraka (6) cases each, Embakasi North and Kasarani (4) cases each. In **Nakuru** the **54** cases are from Naivasha (20), Nakuru East (14), Nakuru North (6), Rongai (5) Nakuru West (4), Njoro (2), Gilgil, Molo and Subukia (1) case each. In **Kiambu** the **40** cases are from Limuru (11), Ruiru (7), Kikuyu (6), Kiambaa and Kiambu Town (4) cases each, Kabete (3), Githunguri and Juja (2) cases each, Lari (1). In **Siaya** the **25** cases are from Alego Usonga (10), Rarieda (5), Bondo (4), Gem (3), Ugenya (2), Ugunja (1). In **Uasin Gishu** the **25** cases are from

Ainabkoi (13), Turbo (9), Kapseret, Kesses and Soy (1) case each. In **Kisumu** the **20** cases are from Kisumu Central (13), Kisumu East (4), Muhoroni (3). In **Nandi** the **19** cases are from Emgwen (9), Chesumei (6), Aldai (4). In **Kakamega** the **14** cases are from Lurambi (5), Ikolomani (3), Butere, Likuyani, Lugari, Matungu, Mumias East and Shinyalu (1) case each. In **Trans Nzoia** the **12** cases are from Kwanza (6), Kiminini (3), Endebess (2), Saboti (1). In **Mombasa** the **11** cases are from Mvita (5), Kisauni (3), Changamwe, Jomvu and Nyali (1) case each. In **Kilifi** the **10** cases are from Malindi (7), Magarini (2), Kilifi North (1). In **Tharaka Nithi** the **8** cases are from Chuka (5), Mwimbi (3). In **Kajiado** the **6** cases are from Kajiado East (4), Loitokitok (2). In **Kericho** the **6** cases are from Ainamoi and Kipkelion East (3) cases each. In **Nyandarua** the **5** cases are from Kinangop (3), Ndaragwa (2). In **Bungoma** the **4** cases are from Bumula, Kanduyi, Tongaren and Webuye West (1) case each. In **Migori** all the **5** cases are from Suna East, while in **Embu** the **5** cases are from Manyatta (4), Mbeere South (1). In **Meru** the **4** cases are from Igembe Central, North, Imenti North and Imenti South (1) case each. In **Murang'a** the **4** cases are from Kiharu and Murang'a South (2) cases each. In **Garissa** the **3** cases from Garissa Town. In **Kirinyaga** the **3**

cases are from Kirinyaga Central (2), West (1). In **Machakos** the **3** cases are from Athi River (2), Kangundo (1).

The **2** cases in **Kwale** are from Lungalunga and Msambweni (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Nyeri** are from Mukurweini and Nyeri Central (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Taita Taveta** are from Voi and the **2** cases in **Tana River** are from Garsen. The **case** in **Makueni** is from Kilome, the **case** in **Narok** is from Narok North, the **case** in **Baringo** is from Koibatek, the **case** in **Busia** is from Teso North, the **case** in **Homa Bay** is from Homa Bay Town, the **case** in **Bomet** is from Bomet Central, the **case** in **Kitui** is from Kitui West and the **case** in **Laikipia** is from Laikipia West.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**14**), 10-19 years (**26**), 20-29 years (**79**), 30-39 (**114**) 40-49 (**89**) 50-59 (**67**) 60 years and above (**91**).

Today **148** patients have recovered from the disease with **81** from various health facilities countrywide while **67** are from Home-Based Isolation and Care. Total recoveries now stand at **180,080** out of which **143,700** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **36,380** are from various health facilities.

Unfortunately, **5** patients have been reported to succumb to the disease. All of them are late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the months of October and November 2020 and June 2021. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **3,737**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years (**0**), 10-19 years (**0**), 20-29 (**0**), 30-39 years (**0**), 40-49 years (**1**), 50-59 years (**0**), 60 years and above (**4**).

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**56**), 10-19 years (**26**), 20-29 (**121**), 30-39 years (**307**), 40-49 years (**445**), 50-59 years (**754**), 60 years and above (**2,028**).

A total of **1,075** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **4,486** are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **121** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **37** of whom are on ventilatory support and **58** on supplemental oxygen. **26** patients are under observation.

Another **216** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **200** of them in general wards and **16** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION: As of today, a total of **1,565,344** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **1,030,853** while second doses are **534,491**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **51.8%** with the majority being males at **55%** while females are at **45%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is **2.0%**.

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows: Aged 58 years and above **165,200**, Others **151,715**, Health Workers **101,020**, Teachers **74,206** while Security Officers are at **42,350**.
