**UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE
MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 15, 2021**

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **456** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,626** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **8.1%**. From the cases **424** are Kenyans while **32** are foreigners. **266** are males and **190** females. The youngest is a **two-month-old infant** while the oldest is **92** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **176,137** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,876,105**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **116**, Kisumu **66**, Busia **42**, Siaya **30**, Mombasa **28**, Kilifi **26**, Homa Bay **22**, Bomet **18**, Kakamega **18**, Nyamira **12**, Nakuru **10**, Uasin Gishu **9**, Trans Nzoia **9**, Kisii **6**, Meru **6**, Kericho **5**, Vihiga **5**, Elgeyo Marakwet **4**, Kiambu **3**, Bungoma **2**, Garissa **2**, Turkana **2**, Kajiado **2**, Laikipia **2**, Machakos **2**, Makueni **1**, Murang'a **1**, Nandi **1**, Narok **1**, Taita Taveta **1**, Tharaka Nithi **1**, Migori **1**, Embu **1** and Kirinyaga **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **116** cases are from Kibra (16), Langata (11), Dagoretti North and Dagoretti South (9) cases each, Ruaraka (8), Kamukunji and Kasarani (7) cases each, Embakasi West, Makadara and Mathare (6) cases each, Embakasi Central, Embakasi East and Roysambu (5) cases each, Embakasi South and Starehe (4) cases each, Embakasi North (3). In **Kisumu** the **66** cases are from Kisumu Central (48), Kisumu West (9), Kisumu East (4), Nyando (3), Nyakach and Seme (1) case each.

In **Busia** the **42** cases are from Matayos (29), Teso South (6), Teso North (5), Bunyala and Butula (1) case each. In **Siaya** the **30** cases are from Bondo (10), Alego-Usonga (9), Rarieda (8), Ugenya (2) Gem (1). In **Mombasa** the **28** cases are from Mvita (19), Jomvu (9), Likoni (4), Kisauni and Nyali (2) cases each,

Changamwe (1). In **Kilifi** the **26** cases are from Magarini (22), Kilifi North and Malindi (2) cases each. In **Homa Bay** the **22** cases are from Homa Bay Town (16), Karachuonyo (4), Rachuonyo South and Rangwe (1) case each.

In **Bomet** the **18** cases are from Bomet Central (9), Chepalungu and Konoin (3) cases each, Bomet East (2), Sotik (1). In **Kakamega** the **18** cases are from Malava (9), Lurambi (6), Matungu (2), Mumias West (1). In **Nyamira** the **12** cases are from Nyamira Town (9), Borabu (2), Manga (1). In **Nakuru** the **10** cases are from Nakuru West (6), Gilgil, Naivasha, Nakuru East and Nakuru North (1) case each.

In **Uasin Gishu** the **9** cases are from Kapseret (3), Ainabkoi and Moiben (2) cases each, Kesses and Turbo (1) case each. In **Trans Nzoia** the **9** cases are from Kiminini (7), Kwanza and Saboti (1) case each. In **Kisii** the **6** cases are from Bomachoge Chache (3), Kitutu Chache South (2), Bonchari (1). In **Meru** the **6** cases are from Buuri and Tigania East (2) cases each, Igembe North and Igembe South (1) case each.

In **Kericho** the **5** cases are from Belgut (3), Kipkelion East (2). In **Vihiga** the **5** cases are from Luanda (2), Hamisi, Sabatia and Vihiga (1) case each. In **Elgeyo Marakwet** all the **4** cases are from Keiyo North. In **Kiambu** the **3** cases are from Kiambu Town,

Kikuyu and Ruiru (1) cases each. The **2** cases in **Bungoma** are from Cheptais and Kanduyi (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Garissa** are from Dadaab, the **2** cases in **Turkana** are from Turkana Central, the **2** cases in **Kajiado** are from Kajiado East, the **2** cases in **Laikipia** are from Laikipia East and the **2** cases in **Machakos** are from Kalama and Machakos Town (1) case each.

The **case** in **Makueni** is from Kaiti, the **case** in **Murang'a** is from Kiharu, the **case** in **Nandi** is from Emgwen, the **case** in **Narok** is from Narok North, the **case** in **Taita Taveta** is from Voi, the **case** in **Tharaka Nithi** is from Muthambi, the **case** in **Migori** is from Awendo, the **case** in **Embu** is from Manyatta and the **case** in **Kirinyaga** is from Kirinyaga West.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**31**), 10-19 years (**25**), 20-29 years (**81**), 30-39 (**110**) 40-49 (**78**) 50-59 (**60**) 60 years and above (**71**).

Today **535** patients have recovered from the disease, **439** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **96** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **120,894** of whom **87,967** are from Home Based Care and

Isolation program, while **32,927** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **7** people have succumbed to the disease, one of them having occurred in the last 24 hours while 6 are late deaths reported after conducting Facility Record Audits on diverse dates in the month of June. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **3,428**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(1)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(6)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(55)**, 10-19 years **(23)**, 20-29 **(111)**, 30-39 years **(283)**, 40-49 years **(419)**, 50-59 years **(702)**, 60 years and above **(1,835)**.

A total of **975** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **4,716** patients are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **100** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **29** of whom are on ventilatory support

and **59** on supplemental oxygen. **12** patients are under observation.

Another **110** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **105** of them in general wards and **5** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION: As of today, a total of **1,138,748** vaccines have so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **989,422** while second doses are **149,326**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **15.0%** with the majority being males at **56.4%** while females are at **43.6%** Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is less than **1%**

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows: Health Workers **42,945**, Others **40,812**, Aged 58 years and above **38,868** Teachers **16,278** while Security Officers are at **10,423**.
