**UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE  
MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 16, 2021**

**PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **485** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,355** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **9.1%**. From the cases **467** are Kenyans while **18** are foreigners. **277** are males and **208** females. The youngest is a **one-month-old infant** while the oldest is **93** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **176,622** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,881,460**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **119**, Homa Bay **68**, Siaya **61**, Kisumu **48**, Mombasa **28**, Busia **24**, Kakamega **19**, Kericho **16**, Nakuru **14**, Bomet **13**, Uasin Gishu **11**, Bungoma **10**, Vihiga **8**, Kisii **7**, Machakos **7**, Kilifi **5**, Nyeri **4**, Narok **4**, Migori **3**, Kajiado **2**, Kiambu **2**, Kirinyaga **2**, Kitui **2**, Nyandarua **2**, West Pokot **2**, Kwale **1**, Laikipia **1**, Murang'a **1** and Nyamira **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **119** cases are from Langata (16), Kibra (13), Westlands (12), Ruaraka (9), Embakasi West, Kamukunji, Kasarani and Makadara (8) cases each, Embakasi East, Embakasi South and Starehe (5) cases each, Dagoretti North, Dagoretti South, Embakasi Central, Embakasi North and Roysambu (4) cases each, Mathare (2). In **Homa Bay** the **68** cases are from Homa Bay Town (45), Rachuonyo South (7), Karachuonyo (5), Mbita (3), Kabondo Kasipul, Ndhiwa, Rangwe and Suba North (2) cases each.

In **Siaya** the **61** cases are from Alego-Usonga (40), Rarieda (14), Gem (3), Bondo (2), Ugenya and Ugunja (1) case each. In **Kisumu** the **48** cases are from Kisumu Central (30), Kisumu West (9), Kisumu East and Seme (4) cases each, Nyando (1). In **Mombasa** the **28** cases are from Mvita (22), Nyali (4), Jomvu and Likoni (1)

cases each. In **Busia** the **24** cases are from Matayos (19), Teso South (3), Nambale and Teso North (1) case each.

In **Kakamega** the **19** cases are from Lurambi (7), Navakholo (4), Matungu and Shinyalu (3) cases each, Ikolomani and Lugari (1) case each. In **Kericho** the **16** cases are from Ainamoi (13), Belgut, Kipkelion East and Kipkelion West (1) case each. In **Nakuru** the **14** cases are from Naivasha (7), Nakuru West (4), Gilgil, Nakuru East and Rongai (1). In **Bomet** the **13** cases are from Sotik (6), Bomet Central and Konoin (3) cases each, Bomet East (1). In **Uasin Gishu** the **11** cases are from Soy (4), Moiben (3), Kesses and Turbo (2) cases each.

In **Bungoma** the **10** cases are from Kanduyi (7), Kabuchai, Sirisia and Webuye West (1) case each. In **Vihiga** the **8** cases are from Hamisi (3), Luanda and Vihiga (2) cases each, Sabatia (1). In **Kisii** all the **7** cases are from Kitutu Chache South. In **Machakos** the **7** cases are from Yatta (4), Kalama (3). In **Kilifi** the **5** cases are from Malindi (4), Magarini (1). In **Nyeri** the **4** cases are from Nyeri Central (3), Mathira West (1). In **Narok** the **4** cases are from Narok North (3) and Narok East (1) while in **Migori** all the **3** cases are from Suna East.

The **2** cases in **Kajiado** are from Kajiado East, the **2** cases in **Kiambu** are from Kiambaa and Limuru (1) case each, the **2** cases

in **Kirinyaga** are from Kirinyaga Central, the **2** cases in **Kitui** are from Mwingi Central, the **2** cases in **Nyandarua** are from Ndaragwa and the **2** cases in **West Pokot** are from West Pokot. The **case** in **Kwale** is from Kinango, the **case** in **Laikipia** is from Laikipia East, the **case** in **Murang'a** is from Kiharu and the **case** in **Nyamira** is from Borabu.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**30**), 10-19 years (**28**), 20-29 years (**75**), 30-39 (**119**) 40-49 (**96**) 50-59 (**60**) 60 years and above (**77**).

Today **312** patients have recovered from the disease, **219** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **93** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **121,206** of whom **88,186** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **33,020** are from various health facilities.

Today there are no reported deaths. The cumulative fatalities remain at **3,428**.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(0)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(55)**, 10-19 years **(23)**, 20-29 **(111)**, 30-39 years **(283)**, 40-49 years **(419)**, 50-59 years **(702)**, 60 years and above **(1,835)**.

A total of **1,076** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **4,810** patients are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **102** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **29** of whom are on ventilatory support and **60** on supplemental oxygen. **13** patients are under observation.

Another **115** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **110** of them in general wards and **5** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

**VACCINATION:** As of today, a total of **1,155,745** vaccines have so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **991,184** while second doses are **164,561**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at

**16.6%** with the majority being females at **56.4%** while males are at **43.6%** Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is less than **1%**

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows:  
Health Workers **46,369**, Others **45,353**, Aged 58 years and above **42,883**, Teachers **18,512** while Security Officers are at **11,444**.
