PRESS STATEMENT

Today **376** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **3,831** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **9.8%**. From the cases **363** are Kenyans while **13** are foreigners. **230** are males and **146** females. The youngest is **an eleven-month-old baby** while the oldest is **91** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **184,537** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,963,532**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **174**, Uasin Gishu **37**, Mombasa **27**, Busia **24**, Kisumu **24**, Siaya **19**, Kwale **7**, Kakamega **7**, Nyamira **7**, Taita Taveta **7**, Nakuru **6**, Nandi **6**, Kericho **6**, Machakos **5**, Kilifi **4**, Bungoma **3**, Vihiga **2**, Kirinyaga **2**, Murang'a **2**, Nyandarua, Trans Nzoia, Meru, Elgeyo Marakwet, Embu, Homa Bay and Kiambu **1** case each.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **174** cases are from Embakasi Central (17), Kibra and Makadara (15) cases each, Langata (14), Embakasi West (13), Dagoretti North and Embakasi East (12) cases each, Starehe (11), Ruaraka (10), Dagoretti South, Kamukunji and Westlands (9) cases each, Embakasi North (8), Mathare (7), Embakasi South (6), Roysambu (4), Kasarani (3). In **Uasin Gishu** the **37** cases are from Moiben (13), Ainabkoi (10), Turbo (5), Kapseret (4), Kesses (3), Soy (2). In **Mombasa** the **27** cases are from Mvita (16), Jomvu (and Kisauni (4) cases each, Nyali (3).

In **Busia** the **24** cases Matayos (21), Nambale (2), Samia (1). In **Kisumu** the **24** cases are from Kisumu Central (15), Nyakach (8), Kisumu East (1). In **Siaya** the **19** cases are from Alego-Usonga and Rarieda (6) cases each, Gem and Ugenya (30 cases each, Bondo (1). In **Kwale** the **7** cases are from Msambweni (6), Matuga

(1). In **Kakamega** the **7** cases are from Butere, Ikolomani, Lurambi, Matungu, Mumias East, Navakholo and Shinyalu (1) case each. In **Nyamira** the **7** cases are from Manga (5), Borabu and Nyamira North (1) case each. In **Taita Taveta** the **7** cases are from Voi (4), Taveta (3). In **Nakuru** the **6** cases are from Naivasha (4), Njoro (2). In **Nandi** the **6** cases are from Chesumei (3), Emgwen (2), Nandi Hills (1). In **Kericho** the **6** cases are from Ainamoi (5), Kipkelion West (1). In **Machakos** the **5** cases are from Kalama and Machakos Town (2) cases each, Mwala (1). In **Kilifi** the **4** cases are from Malindi (2), Kaloleni and Magarini (1) case each. In **Bungoma** all the **3** cases are from Kanduyi.

The **2** cases in **Vihiga** are from Emuhaya and Hamisi (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Kirinyaga** are from Mwea West and the **2** cases in **Murang'a** are from Kandara and Kiharu (1) case each. The **case** in **Nyandarua** is from Olkalou, the **case** in **Trans Nzoia** is from Saboti, the **case** in **Meru** is from Imenti North, the **case** in **Elgeyo Marakwet** is from Marakwet West, the **case** in **Embu** is from Manyatta, the **case** in **Homa Bay** is from Homa Bay Town and the **case** in **Kiambu** is from Lari.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(38)**, 10-19 years **(15)**, 20-29 years **(58)**, 30-39 **(94)** 40-49 **(54)** 50-59 **(63)** 60 years and above **(54)**.

Today **910** patients have recovered from the disease, **516** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **394** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **126,594** out of whom **91,514** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **35,080** are from various health facilities.

Sadly, **6** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits on diverse dates in the months of April and June 2021. The cumulative fatalities now stand at **3,640**. Our sincere condolences to all those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(1)**, 60 years and above **(4)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**56**), 10-19 years (**26**), 20-29 (**117**), 30-39 years (**301**), 40-49 years (**435**), 50-59 years (**734**), 60 years and above (**1,971**).

A total of **1,127** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **5,722** patients are under Home Based Isolation and Care program. **130** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **39** of whom are on ventilatory support and **53** on supplemental oxygen. **38** patients are under observation.

Another **168** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **153** of them in general wards and **15** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION: As of today, a total of **1,417,100** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **1,010,954** while second doses are **406,146**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **40.2%** with the majority being males at **55%** while females are at **45%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is **1.56%**.

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows:
Aged 58 years and above **127,008**, Others **109,918**, Health
Workers **84,432**, Teachers **54,074** while Security Officers are at
30,714.
