**UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE
MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 24, 2021**

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **741** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,955** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **10.7%**. From the cases **698** are Kenyans while **43** are foreigners. **464** are males and **277** females. The youngest is a **one-year-old baby** while the oldest is **101** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **181,239** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,926,973**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **146**, Busia **92**, Siaya **76**, Kisumu **51**, Mombasa **47**, Kericho **39**, Kitui **37**, Kisii **35**, Uasin Gishu **27**, Kakamega **26**, Nyamira **21**, Kilifi **17**, Vihiga **16**, Nandi **16**, Homa Bay **14**, Nakuru **13**, Kiambu **10**, Meru **10**, Bungoma **9**, Kajiado **5**, Kirinyaga **4**, Nyeri **4**, Tana River **4**, Machakos **3**, Murang'a **3**, Baringo **3**, Bomet, Garissa, Makeni, Migori and Nyandarua **2** cases each, West Pokot, Isiolo, and Elgeyo Marakwet **1** case each.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **146** cases are from Makadara (15), Langata (14), Starehe (12), Dagoretti North and Kibra (11) cases each, Mathare (10), Kamukunji (9), Embakasi Central, Embakasi West and Westlands (8) cases each, Embakasi East, (7), Dagoretti South, Embakasi North, Embakasi South and Ruaraka (6) cases each, Roysambu 5, Kasarani (4). In **Busia** the **92** cases are from Matayos (62), Teso North (26), Teso South (4). In **Siaya** the **76** cases are from Bondo (26), Alego-Usonga, Gem (14), Rarieda (8), Ugenya (7), Ugunja (1).

In **Kisumu** the **51** cases are from Kisumu Central (26), Kisumu West (8), Kisumu East (7), Nyakach and Seme (3) cases each, Muhoroni and Nyando (2) cases each. In **Mombasa** the **47** cases are from Changamwe (15), Jomvu (13), Mvita (10), Likoni

(4), Kisauni (3), Nyali (2). In **Kericho** the **39** cases are from Bureti (22), Ainamoi (7), Belgut (6), Kipkelion East (2), Kipkelion West and Sigowet/Soin (1) cases each. In **Kitui** the **37** cases are from Kitui Central (26), Kitui East (6), Kitui Rural and Kitui West (2) cases each, Kitui South (1). In **Kisii** the **35** cases are from South Mugirango (7), Bomachoge Borabu, Kitutu Chache North, Kitutu Chache South and Nyaribari Masaba (6) cases each, Nyaribari Chache (3), Bobasi (1). In **Uasin Gishu** the **27** cases are from Ainabkoi (7), Kapseret (6), Soy (5), Moiben (4), Turbo (3), Kesses (2). In **Kakamega** the **26** cases are from Lurambi (11), Ikolomani (3), Butere, Kwhisero, Likuyani, Lugari, Matungu and Shinyalu (2) cases each. In **Nyamira** the **21** cases are from Nyamira North (14), Borabu (4), Masaba North (3).

In **Kilifi** the **17** cases are from Malindi (12), Kaloleni and Kilifi North (2) cases each, Magarini (1). In **Vihiga** the **16** cases are from Emuhaya (5), Luanda (4), Sabatia and Vihiga (3) cases each, Hamisi (1). In **Nandi** the **16** cases are from Chesumei (6), Emgwen (4), Nandi Hills (3), Aldai (2), Mosop (1). In **Homa Bay** the **14** cases are from Homa Bay Town (8), Mbita and Rangwe (2) cases each, Karachuonyo and Rachuonyo South (1) case each.

In **Nakuru** the **13** cases are from Nakuru East (5) Gilgil (3), Rongai (2), Nakuru North, Njoro and Nakuru West (1) case each. In

Kiambu the **10** cases are from Thika (3), Kiambaa and Kiambu Town (2) cases each, Kikuyu, Lari and Ruiru (1) case each. In **Meru** the **10** cases are from Igembe Central (3), Igembe North and Imenti Central (2) cases each, Buuri, Igembe South and Imenti North (1) case each.

In **Bungoma** the **9** cases are from Kanduyi and Kimilili (3) cases each, Cheptais (2), Sirisia (1). In **Kajiado** the **5** cases are from Kajiado East and Kajiado North (2) cases each, Kajiado Central (1). In **Kirinyaga** the **4** cases are from Kirinyaga Central (3), Mathira East (1). In **Nyeri** the **4** cases are from Mukurweini, Nyeri Central, South and Tetu (1) case each. In **Tana River** the **4** cases are from Bura and Galole (2) cases each. In **Machakos** the **3** cases are from Machakos Town (2), Yatta (1).

In **Murang'a** the **3** cases are from Gatanga, Kandara and Kiharu (1) case each. In **Baringo** the **3** cases are from Koibatek (2), Baringo Central (1). The **2** cases in **Bomet** are from Bomet East and Chepalungu (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Garissa** are from Dadaab, the **2** cases in **Makueni** are from Kibwezi East and Kilome (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Migori** are from Rongo and the **2** cases in **Nyandarua** are from Ol Kalou. The **case** in **West Pokot** is from West Pokot, the **case** in **Isiolo** is from Merti and the **case** in **Elgeyo Marakwet** is from Keiyo North.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(9)**, 10-19 years **(52)**, 20-29 years **(142)**, 30-39 **(175)** 40-49 **(148)** 50-59 **(104)** 60 years and above **(111)**.

Today **99** patients have recovered from the disease, **52** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **47** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **123,462** of whom **89,450** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **34,012** are from various health facilities.

Unfortunately, **24** patients have succumbed to the disease all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility audit records on diverse dates in the months of March, April, May and June. The cumulative fatalities now stand at **3,538**. Our sincere condolences to all those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(1)**, 30-39 years **(1)**, 40-49 years **(2)**, 50-59 years **(5)**, 60 years and above **(15)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**55**), 10-19 years (**25**), 20-29 (**115**), 30-39 years (**295**), 40-49 years (**426**), 50-59 years (**713**), 60 years and above (**1,909**).

A total of **1,059** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **6,599** patients are under Home Based Isolation and Care program. **100** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **36** of whom are on ventilatory support and **51** on supplemental oxygen. **13** patients are under observation.

Another **140** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **131** of them in general wards and **9** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION: As of today, a total of **1,220,151** vaccines have so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **998,073** while second doses are **222,442**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **22.3%** with the majority being males at **56%** while females are at **44%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is now at **0.86%**.

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows:
Health Workers **57,640**, Aged 58 years and above **61,971**, Others
59,897, Teachers **26,504** while Security Officers are at **16,430**.
