PRESS STATEMENT

Today **646** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,429** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **10.1%**. From the cases **626** are Kenyans while **20** are foreigners. **351** are males and **295** females. The youngest is a **seven-month-old baby** while the oldest is **92** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **181,885** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,933,402**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **115**, Siaya **83**, Kisumu **67**, Mombasa **55**, Busia **46**, Uasin Gishu **34**, Nakuru **32**,

Kakamega **31**, Kisii **29**, Vihiga **17**, Kericho **16**, Kiambu **16**, Meru **14**, Machakos **14**, Homa Bay **13**, Nandi **8**, Bungoma **7**, Trans Nzoia **7**, Kilifi **7**, Kajiado **6**, Turkana **4**, Murang'a **3**, Kwale **3**, Nyeri **3**, Garissa **2**, Laikipia **2**, Narok **2**, Nyandarua **2**, Kitui **2**, Wajir **1**, West Pokot **1**, Baringo **1**, Elgeyo Marakwet **1**, Marsabit **1** and Migori **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **115** cases are from Makadara (12), Kibra (11), Dagoretti South, Langata, Mathare and Ruaraka (9) cases each, Kamukunji, Westlands, and Embakasi East (7) cases each, Dagoretti North, Kasarani, and Roysambu (6) cases each, Embakasi Central (5), Embakasi North (4), Embakasi South and Starehe (3) cases each, Embakasi West (2). In Siaya the **83** cases are from Alego-Usonga (35), Gem (25), Ugenya (10), Rarieda (9), Ugunja (3), Bondo (1).

In **Kisumu** the **67** cases are from Kisumu Central (40), Kisumu West (12), Kisumu East (8), Muhoroni (3), Nyakach (2), Nyando and Seme (1) case each. In **Mombasa** the **55** Cases are from Mvita (31), Nyali (14), Kisauni (4), Likoni (3), Jomvu (2), Changanwe (1). In **Busia** the **46** cases are from Matayos (23), Teso North (13), Teso South (5), Butula (4), Samia (1). In **Uasin**

Gishu the **34** cases are from Ainabkoi (15), Kapseret and Turbo (6) cases each, Moiben and Soy (3) cases each, Kesses (1).

In **Nakuru** the **32** cases are from Nakuru West (16), Nakuru East (6), Rongai (5), Naivasha (4), Subukia (1). In **Kakamega** the **31** cases are from Lurambi (13), Ikolomani (5), Mumias East (3), Butere, Matungu, Mumias West and Navakholo (2) cases each, Likuyani and Malava (1) cases each. In **Kisii** the **29** cases are from Kitutu Chache South (9), Bonchari (6), Bomachoge Chache and Kitutu Chache North (4) cases each, Bobasi and Nyaribari Chache (3) cases each.

In **Vihiga** the **17** cases are from Luanda (7), Sabatia (4), Emuhaya and Vihiga (3) cases each. In **Kericho** the **16** cases are from Ainamoi (14), Kipkelion East (2). In **Kiambu** the **16** cases are from Limuru (7), Ruiru (5), Kiambaa (2), Gatundu South and Kabete (1) case each. In **Meru** the **14** cases are from Imenti Central and Imenti North (5) cases each, Tigania East (2), Buuri and Tigania West (1) case each. In **Machakos** the **14** cases are from Machakos Town (5), Masinga (3), Athi River, Kalama and Matungulu (2) cases each. In **Homa Bay** the **13** cases are from Homa Bay Town (6), Mbita (3), Rachuonyo South (2), Karachuonyo and Rangwe (1) case each. In **Nandi** the **8** cases are from Emgwen

(3), Aldai (2), Chesumei, Mosop and Nandi Hills (1) case each. In **Kilifi**, the **7** cases are from Kaloleni (4), Malindi (3).

In **Bungoma** the **7** cases are from Kimilili (4), Webuye West (2), Kanduyi (1). In **Trans Nzoia** the **7** cases Cherangany, Kiminini and Kwanza (2) cases each, Saboti (1). In **Kajiado** the **6** cases are from Kajiado North (5), Kajiado East (1). In **Turkana** the **4** cases are from Turkana Central (3), Turkana West (1). In **Murang'a** the **3** cases are from Kiharu (2), Murang'a South (1). In **Kwale** the **3** cases are from Msambweni. In **Nyeri** the **3** cases are from Nyeri Central.

The **2** cases in **Garissa** are from Dadaab, the **2** cases in **Laikipia** are from Laikipia East, the **2** cases in **Narok** are from Narok North and Narok South (1) case each and the **2** cases in **Nyandarua** are from Kinangop and Olkalou (1) case each. The **2** cases in **Kitui** is from Mwingi North and Kitui Central (1) case each.

The **case** in **Wajir** is from Wajir East, the **case** in **West Pokot** is from West Pokot, the **case** in **Baringo** is from Marigat, the **case** in **Elgeyo Marakwet** is from Marakwet West, the **case** in **Marsabit** is from Laisamis and the **case** in **Migori** is from Awendo.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(17)**, 10-19 years **(60)**, 20-29 years **(101)**, 30-39 **(149)** 40-49 **(124)** 50-59 **(83)** 60 years and above **(112)**.

Today **391** patients have recovered from the disease, **211** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **180** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **123,853** of whom **89,661** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **34,192** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **18** patients have succumbed to the disease, **one** in having occurred in the last 24 hours while **17** are late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits on diverse dates in the months of May and June. The cumulative fatalities now stand at **3,556**. Our sincere condolences to all those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(2)**, 40-49 years **(2)**, 50-59 years **(4)**, 60 years and above **(10)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(55)**, 10-19 years **(25)**, 20-29 **(115)**, 30-39 years **(297)**, 40-49 years **(428)**, 50-59 years **(717)**, 60 years and above **(1,919)**.

A total of **1,017** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **6,653** patients are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **102** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **33** of whom are on ventilatory support and **52** on supplemental oxygen. **17** patients are under observation.

Another **128** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **119** of them in general wards and **9** in High Dependency Units (HDU).
