**UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE
MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 26, 2021**

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **508** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,664** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **7.6%**. From the cases **486** are Kenyans while **22** are foreigners. **299** are males and **209** females. The youngest is **a one-year-old baby** while the oldest is **105** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **182,393** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,940,066**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **116**, Siaya **50**, Mombasa **44**, Busia **43**, Kisumu **38**, Kakamega **31**, Uasin Gishu **30**, Nyamira **16**, Kilifi **16**, Nandi **16**, Homa Bay **15**, Kajiado **14**, Bungoma **14**, Vihiga **11**, Nakuru **7**, Nyeri **7**, Laikipia **6**, Migori **5**, Kiambu **5**, Kericho **4**, Taita Taveta **4**, Garissa **3**, Kwale **3**, Meru **2**, Narok **2**, Trans Nzoia **1**, Baringo **1**, Machakos **1**, Elgeyo Marakwet **1** and Kisii **1**, Kitui **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **116** cases are from Starehe (15), Embakasi West (13), Langata (11), Dagoretti North (10), Westlands (8), Embakasi South and Makadara (7) cases each, Embakasi Central, Kamukunji, Kasarani and Roysambu (6) cases each, Dagoretti South, Kibra, Ruaraka (4) cases each, Embakasi East, Embakasi North and Mathare (3) cases each. In **Siaya** the **50** cases are from Alego-Usonga (26), Gem (13), Ugunja (8), Rarieda (3). In **Mombasa** the **44** cases are from Kisauni (12), Nyali (8), Jomvu and Mvita (7) cases each, Changamwe and Likoni (5) cases each.

In **Busia** the **43** cases are from Matayos (23), Teso North (10), Teso South (5), Bunyala and Butula (2) cases each. In **Kisumu** the **38** cases are from Kisumu Central (16), Kisumu East (13), Nyakach (5), Nyando (2), Kisumu West and Seme (1) case each. In

Kakamega the **31** cases are from Lurambi (9), Ikolomani (6), Khwisero (4), Likuyani and Shinyalu (3) cases each, Butere and Mumias West (2) cases each, Lugari and Navakholo (1) case each. In **Uasin Gishu** the **30** cases are from Ainabkoi (11), Turbo (7), Kesses (6), Soy (3), Kapseret (2), Moiben (1). In **Nyamira** the **16** cases are from Manga (8), Nyamira (7), Borabu (1). In **Kilifi** the **16** cases are from Magarini (10), Kilifi North (4), Rabai (2). In **Nandi** the **16** cases are from Emgwen (9), Chesumei (6), Mosop (1). In **Homa Bay** the **15** cases are from Homa Bay Town (13), Karachuonyo and Rachuonyo South (1) case each. In **Kajiado** the **14** cases are from Kajiado East (7), Loitokitok (4), Kajiado North (3). In **Bungoma** the **14** cases are from Kanduyi (5), Cheptais and Tongaren (3) cases each, Bumula (2), Kabuchai (1). In **Vihiga** the **11** cases are from Vihiga (4), Hamisi and Sabatia (3) cases each, Luanda (1). In **Nakuru** the **7** cases are from Nakuru West (6), Naivasha (1). In **Nyeri** the **7** cases are from Nyeri Central (6), Tetu (1). In **Laikipia** the **6** cases are from Laikipia East (5), Laikipia West (1). In **Migori** the **5** cases are from Kuria West (4), Suna East (1). In **Kiambu** the **5** cases are from Githunguri and Ruiru (2) cases each, Kikuyu (1). In **Kericho** the **4** cases are from Ainamoi (2), Belgut and Sigowet/Soin (1) case each. In **Taita Taveta** the **4** cases are

from Taveta (3), Voi (1). In **Garissa** the **3** cases are from Garissa Town (2), Fafi (1). In **Kwale** the **3** cases are from Msambweni. In **Meru** the **2** cases are from Igembe Central and Imenti South (1) case each, while in **Narok** the **2** cases are from Narok North. The **case** in **Trans Nzoia** is from Kiminini, the **case** in **Baringo** is from Koibatek, the **case** in **Machakos** is from Athi River, the **case** in **Elgeyo Marakwet** is from Marakwet East, the **case** in **Kisii** is from Bonchari and the **case** in **Kitui** is from Kitui Central.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**20**), 10-19 years (**35**), 20-29 years (**96**), 30-39 (**104**) 40-49 (**87**) 50-59 (**62**) 60 years and above (**104**).

Today **539** patients have recovered from the disease, **296** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **243** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **124,392** of whom **89,957** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **34,435** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **18** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record

audits on diverse dates in the months of March, April and June. The cumulative fatalities now stand at **3,574**. Our sincere condolences to all those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years (**0**), 10-19 years (**0**), 20-29 (**0**), 30-39 years (**2**), 40-49 years (**2**), 50-59 years (**4**), 60 years and above (**10**).

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**55**), 10-19 years (**25**), 20-29 (**115**), 30-39 years (**297**), 40-49 years (**428**), 50-59 years (**717**), 60 years and above (**1,919**).

A total of **1,037** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **6,750** patients are under Home Based Isolation and Care program. **101** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **33** of whom are on ventilatory support and **52** on supplemental oxygen. **16** patients are under observation.

Another **117** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **108** of them in general wards and **9** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION: As of 25.06.2021, a total of **1,279,023** vaccines have so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **1,001,711** while second doses are **277,312**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **27.7%** with the majority being males at **56%** while females are at **44%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is now at **1.06%**.

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows: Aged 58 years and above **81,273**, Others **74,129**, Health Workers **66,899**, Teachers **34,442** while Security Officers are at **20,569**.
