UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE MEASURES, AS AT JUNE 30, 2021

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **558** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,357** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **8.8%**. From the cases **529** are Kenyans while **29** are foreigners. **293** are males and **265** females. The youngest is **an eight-month-old baby** while the oldest is **91** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **184,161** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,959,701**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **137**, Mombasa **57**, Siaya **53**, Kisii **50**, Kilifi **35**, Uasin Gishu **32**, Busia **27**, Nakuru **23**,

Kisumu **23**, Vihiga **17**, Kakamega **13**, Kiambu **12**, Kericho **10**, Kwale **9**, Murang'a **7**, Taita Taveta **6**, Kitui **5**, Homa Bay **5**, Migori **5**, Laikipia **4**, Narok **4**, Bomet **3**, Kajiado **3**, Machakos **3**, Bungoma **3**, Tharaka Nithi **2**, Embu **2**, Kirinyaga **2**, Meru **2**, Nyandarua **1**, Tana River **1**, Trans Nzoia **1** and West Pokot **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Nairobi** the **137** cases are from Kasarani (17), Embakasi Central (14), Embakasi West (13), Ruaraka (12), Westlands (10), Makadara and Kamukunji (9) cases each, Embakasi East (8), Dagoretti North and Mathare (7) cases each, Roysambu (6), Starehe (5), Dagoretti South, Embakasi North, Embakasi South, Kibra and Langata (4) cases each. In **Mombasa** the **57** cases are from Mvita (33), Nyali (11). In **Siaya** the **53** cases are from Rarieda (20), Alego-Usonga (18), Bondo (11), Ugenya (2), Gem and Ugunja (1) case each.

In **Kisii** the **50** cases are from Bomachoge Chache (18), Bomachoge Borabu (14), Nyaribari Chache (11), Kitutu Chache South (7). In **Kilifi** the **35** cases are from Magarini (25), Kilifi North (8), Kaloleni, Kilifi South (1) case each. In **Uasin Gishu** the **32** cases are from Ainabkoi (15), Kesses (8), Kapseret (4), Turbo (3), Moiben and Soy (1) case each. In **Busia** the **27** cases are from Teso North (10), Matayos (9), Teso South (5), Butula (2), Nambale

(1). In **Nakuru** the **23** cases are from Rongai (7), Naivasha (6), Nakuru East (5), Nakuru West (2), Gilgil, Nakuru North and Subukia (1) case each. In **Kisumu** the **23** cases are from Kisumu Central (13), Kisumu West and Nyando (3) cases each, Kisumu East and Muhoroni (2) cases each. In **Vihiga** the **17** cases are from Luanda (6), Hamisi (4), Emuhaya (3), Sabatia (2), Saboti and Vihiga (1) case each. In **Kakamega** the **13** cases are from Lurambi (5), Shinyalu, Kwhisero (2), Ikolomani and Navakholo (1) case each. In **Kiambu** the **12** cases are from Limuru (4), Lari and Ruiru (2) cases each, Githunguri, Kabete, Kiambaa and Kikuyu (1) case each. In **Kericho** the **10** cases are from Belgut (7), Ainamoi (2), Bureti (1). In **Kwale** the **9** cases are from Msambweni (6), Kinango (3). In **Murang'a** the **7** cases are from Kiharu (6), Changamwe and Jomvu (4) cases each, Kisauni (3), Likoni (2), Kandara (1). In **Taita Taveta** all the **6** cases are from Voi. In **Kitui** all the **5** cases are from Kitui Central. In **Homa Bay** the **5** cases are from Homa Bay Town (3), Rachuonyo South (2). In **Migori** the **5** cases are from Rongo (4), Suna East (1). In **Laikipia** the **4** cases are from Laikipia West, while in **Narok** the **4** cases are from Narok North (3), Narok South (1). In **Bomet** the **3** cases are from Chepalungu, Konoin and Sotik (1) case each. In **Kajiado** the **3** cases are from Kajiado East (2), Kajiado North (1).

In **Machakos** the **3** cases are from Machakos Town, Matungulu and Yatta (1) case each. The **3** cases in **Bungoma** are from Kanduyi. The **2** cases in **Tharaka Nithi** are from Mwimbi and Tharaka South (1) case each, the **2** cases in **Embu** are from Manyatta, the **2** cases in **Kirinyaga** are from Kirinyaga Central and the **2** cases in **Meru** are from Tigania East and West (1) case each. The **case** in **Nyandarua** is from Ndaragwa, the **case** in **Tana River** is from Galole, the **case** in **Trans Nzoia** is from Kwanza and the **case** in **West Pokot** is from West Pokot.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**25**), 10-19 years (**41**), 20-29 years (**75**), 30-39 (**143**) 40-49 (**108**) 50-59 (**68**) 60 years and above (**98**).

Today **296** patients have recovered from the disease, **229** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **67** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **125,684** out of who **90,998** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **34,686** are from various health facilities.

Unfortunately, **13** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record

audits on diverse dates in the months of January, February, March and June 2021. The cumulative fatalities now stand at **3,634**. Our sincere condolences to all those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(6)**, 60 years and above **(6)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(56)**, 10-19 years **(26)**, 20-29 **(117)**, 30-39 years **(301)**, 40-49 years **(434)**, 50-59 years **(733)**, 60 years and above **(1,967)**.

A total of **1,114** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **6,644** patients are under Home Based Isolation and Care program. **113** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **34** of whom are on ventilatory support and **51** on supplemental oxygen. **28** patients are under observation.

Another **120** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **113** of them in general wards and **17** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

VACCINATION: As of today, a total of **1,378,585** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **1,008,120** while second doses are **370,465**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **36.7%** with the majority being males at **55%** while females are at **45%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is **1.42%**

The uptake of the second dose by Priority Groups is as follows: Aged 58 years and above **115,078**, Others **99,211**, Health Workers **79,686**, Teachers **48,572** while Security Officers are at **27,918**.
