**PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **589** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,995** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now **11.8%**. From the cases **580** are Kenyans while **9** are foreigners. **343** are males and **246** females. The youngest is a **five-month-old baby** while the oldest is **101** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **173,661** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **1,845,884**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Kisumu **100**, Nairobi **91**, Bungoma **60**, Homa Bay **54**, Siaya **49**, Uasin Gishu **37**, Busia **32**, Nandi **24**, Mombasa **17**, Nakuru **17**, Kakamega **12**, Nyeri **11**, Migori **11**, Vihiga **9**, Kiambu **8**, Bomet **7**, Meru **7**, Kericho **6**, Kilifi **6**, Kisii **5**, Elgeyo Marakwet **5**, Murang'a **4**, Kajiado **3**, West Pokot **2**, Nyandarua **2**, Samburu **1**, Taita Taveta **1**, Trans Nzoia **1**, Turkana **1**, Embu **1**, Laikipia **1**, Machakos **1**, Narok **1**, Nyamira **1** and Garissa **1**.

In terms of **Sub County** distribution; In **Kisumu** the **100** cases are from Kisumu Central (48), Kisumu East (19), Kisumu West (13), Nyando (8), Seme (6), Nyakach (4), Muhoroni (2). In **Nairobi** the **91** cases are from Starehe (13), Kasarani (9), Ruaraka (8), Roysambu and Kibra (7) cases each, Embakasi Central, Embakasi South, Langata, Mathare and Westlands (5) cases each, Embakasi West and Makadara (4) cases each, Dagoretti North, Embakasi East, Embakasi North and Kamukunji (3) cases each, Dagoretti South (2).

In **Bungoma** the **60** cases are from Kanduyi (50), Cheptais (3), Mt. Elgon and Sirisia (2) cases each, Bumula, Tongaren and Webuye West (1) case each. In **Homa Bay** the **54** cases are from Homa Bay Town (30), Ndhiwa and Suba North (5) cases each,

Rachuonyo South and Rangwe (4) cases each, Karachuonyo (3), Kabondo Kasipul (2) Mbita (1). In **Siaya** the **49** cases are from Rarieda (26), Alego-Usonga (15), Ugunja (3), Bondo and Ugenya (2) cases each, Gem (1).

In **Uasin Gishu** the **37** cases are from Turbo (16), Ainabkoi (10), Kapseret (6), Kesses (3), Moiben and Soy (1) case each. In **Busia** the **32** cases are from Matayos (17), Teso South (8), Teso North (5), Bunyala and Butula (1) case each. In **Nandi** the **24** cases are from Emgwen (23), Tinderet (1). In **Mombasa** the **17** cases are from Mvita (7), Kisauni (4), Jomvu (3), Changamwe (2), Nyali (1). In **Nakuru** the **17** cases are from Naivasha (10), Nakuru East (4), Nakuru West (2), Rongai (1). In **Kakamega** the **12** cases are from Lurambi (3), Malava and Shinyalu (2) cases each, Khwisero, Likuyani, Matungu, Mumias East and Mumias West (1) case each. In **Nyeri** the **11** cases are from Nyeri Central (9), Kieni West and Mathira West (1) case each. In **Migori** the **11** cases are from Rongo (4), Awendo (3), Suna East (2), Kuria West and Suna West (1) case each. In **Vihiga** the **9** cases are from Vihiga (6), Emuhaya (2), Hamisi (1). In **Kiambu** the **8** cases are from Kabete and Thika (3) cases each, Ruiru (2). In **Bomet** the **7** cases are from Bomet Central and Konoin (2) cases each, Bomet East, Chepalungu and

Sotik (1) case each. In **Meru** the **7** cases are from Imenti North (3), Imenti Central (2), Buuri and Tigania East (1) case each.

In **Kericho** the **6** cases are from Kipkelion East (3), Ainamoi (2), Belgut (1). In **Kilifi** all the **6** cases are from Malindi. In **Kisii** all the **5** cases are from Kitutu Chache South. In **Elgeyo Marakwet** the **5** cases are from Keiyo North and Marakwet West (2) cases each, Keiyo South (1). In **Murang'a** the **4** cases are from Murang'a South (3) and Kigumo (1). In **Kajiado** the **3** cases are from Kajiado East (2), Loitokitok (1). In **West Pokot** the **2** cases are from West Pokot while in **Nyandarua** the **2** cases are from Oljoroorok and Olkalou (1) case each.

The **case** in **Samburu** is from Samburu Central, the **case** in **Taita Taveta** is from Taveta, the **case** in **Trans Nzoia** is from Cherangany, the **case** in **Turkana** is from Turkana Central, the **case** in **Embu** is from Manyatta, the case in **Laikipia** is from Laikipia West, the **case** in **Machakos** is from Kalama, the **case** in **Narok** is from Narok North, the **case** in **Nyamira** is from Borabu and the **case** in **Garissa** is from Garissa Town.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(37)**, 10-19 years **(31)**, 20-29 years **(95)**, 30-39 **(146)** 40-49 **(108)** 50-59 **(62)** 60 years and above **(110)**.

Today **312** patients have recovered from the disease, **184** from the Home Based and Isolation Care program while **128** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **118,933** of whom **86,338** are from Home Based Care and Isolation program, while **32,595** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **19** people have been reported to succumb to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting Facility Record Audits on diverse dates in the month of April and May. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **3,345**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(4)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(5)**, 60 years and above **(9)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(55)**, 10-19 years **(23)**, 20-29 **(110)**, 30-39 years **(273)**, 40-49 years **(412)**, 50-59 years **(692)**, 60 years and above **(1,780)**.

A total of **994** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **5,049** patients are under the Home Based Isolation and Care program. **114** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **29** of whom are on ventilatory support and **65** on supplemental oxygen. **20** patients are under observation.

Another **93** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **86** of them in general wards and **7** in High Dependency Units (HDU).

### **VACCINATION:**

The Ministry of Health wants to assure all Kenyans who got their first dose, that they will get their second dose at the expected time frame. The due date for the **2<sup>nd</sup> dose** will be communicated via an SMS from the CHANJO SYSTEM, **48 hours prior to the vaccination** hence there is no need to panic.

The Ministry is also urging all those in the targeted priority groups who received their first dose to ensure they take their second dose as this will give them full protection against Covid-19. Remember, the 1<sup>st</sup> dose only gives you partial protection while 2 doses give you full protection.

As of today, a total of **1,030,445** vaccines have so far been administered across the country. Of these, total first doses are **979,955** while total 2nd doses are **50,490**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose is at **5.15%** with the majority being males at **57%** while females are at **43%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated is **less than 1%**.

The uptake of the second dose by occupation is as follows; Health Workers **18,230**, Others **12,194**, Aged 58 years and above **12,174**, Teachers **4,789** while Security Officers **3,103**.
