PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of October 21st 2021, a total of **4,826,129** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,457,839** were

partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,368,290**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **37.7%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **5.0%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **15.8%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **13.3%**, Kiambu **8.0%**, Uasin Gishu with **7.4%**, Nyandarua **6.8%**, Kisumu **6.2%**, Mombasa **5.9%**, while Lamu, Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **124** people have tested positive

for the disease, from a sample size of **7,356** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.7%**. From the cases **112** are Kenyans while **12** are foreigners. **68** males while **56** are females. The youngest is a **two-year-old child** while the oldest is **97** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **252,499** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,664,357**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **28**, Uasin Gishu **19**, Kisii **8**, Makueni **8**, Bungoma **7**, West Pokot **6**, Kakamega **6**, Kericho **6**, Siaya **5**, Kiambu **4**, Nakuru **4**, Narok **4**, Kirinyaga **3**, Murang'a **3**, Tharaka Nithi **2**, Isiolo **2**, Vihiga **1**, Busia **1**, Homa bay **1**, Kajiado **1**, Nyandarua **1**, Kisumu **1**, Laikipia **1**, Meru **1** and Mombasa **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(2)**, 10-19 years **(6)**, 20-29 years **(19)**, 30-39 **(23)**, 40-49 **(12)**, 50-59 **(26)**, 60 years and above **(36)**.

Today **80** patients have recovered from the disease with **68** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **12** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **245,962** of whom **198,699** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,263** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **6** patients have succumbed to the disease, **all** of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the months of August, September and October 2021. This now pushes the cumulative deaths to **5,249**. Our sincere condolences to the families and those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(5)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(378)**, 40-49 years **(608)**, 50-59 years **(984)** 60 years and above **(3,042)**.

A total of **522** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,414** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **30** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **13** of whom are on ventilatory support and **17** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **167** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen and **all** of them are in the general wards. **No** patient is in High Dependency Units (HDU).
