PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of October 23rd 2021, a total of **4,930, 336** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,504,400** were

partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,425,936**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **38.7%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **5.2%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **16.3%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **14.0%**, Kiambu **8.3%**, Uasin Gishu with **7.6%**, Nyandarua **7.1%**, Kisumu **6.6%**, Mombasa **6.2%**, while Lamu, Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received their first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi county is on the lead with **33.0%** of its population receiving the

first dose while Marsabit County is the least with **1.4%** of the population having received the first dose.

On the Covid-19 situation today **44** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,238** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.0%**. From the cases all the **44** are Kenyans. **25** males while **19** are females. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **84** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **252,672** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,673,705**.

In terms of **County** distribution, Nyamira **11**, Nairobi **9**, Isiolo **6**, Nakuru **6**, Uasin Gishu **3**, Kakamega **2**, Siaya **2**, Tharaka Nithi **2**, Elgeyo Marakwet **1**, Kisii **1** and Meru **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**2**), 10-19 years (**3**), 20-29 years (**5**), 30-39 (**11**), 40-49 (**5**), 50-59 (**8**), 60 years and above (**10**).

Today **247** patients have recovered from the disease with **200** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **47** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **246,274** of whom **198,948** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,326** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **2** patients have succumbed to the disease, **all** of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of September 2021. This now pushes the cumulative deaths to **5,257**. Our sincere condolences to the families and those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(2)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(379)**, 40-49 years **(609)**, 50-59 years **(985)** 60 years and above **(3,047)**.

A total of **496** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,365** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **27** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **12** of whom are on ventilatory support and **15** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **164** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **156** of them in the general wards. **8** patients are in the High Dependency Units (HDU).
