### **PRESS STATEMENT**

#### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of October 24<sup>th</sup> 2021, a total of **4,944, 441** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,513,683** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,430,758**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **38.7%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **5.3%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **16.4%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **14.1%**, Kiambu **8.3%**, Uasin Gishu with **7.6%**, Nyandarua **7.1%**, Kisumu **6.6%**, Mombasa **6.2%**, while Lamu, Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **16** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **1,318** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.2%**. From the cases all the **16** are Kenyans. **9** males while **7** are females. The youngest is a **20-year-old** while the oldest is **78** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **252,688** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,675,023**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Kakamega **3**, Meru **3**, Nairobi **2**, West Pokot **2**, Homa Bay **1**, Kajiado **1**, Kericho **1**, Mombasa **1**, Siaya **1** and Uasin Gishu **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 years **(3)**, 30-39 **(5)**, 40-49 **(1)**, 50-59 **(1)**, 60 years and above **(6)**.

Today **81** patients have recovered from the disease with **71** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **10** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **246,355** of whom **199,019** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,336** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **3** patients have succumbed to the disease, **all** of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility audit records in September and October 2021. This now pushes the cumulative deaths to **5,260**. Our sincere condolences to the families and those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(2)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(379)**, 40-49 years **(610)**, 50-59 years **(985)** 60 years and above **(3,049)**.

A total of **493** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,321** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **29** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **13** of whom are on ventilatory support and **16** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **163** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **155** of them in the general wards. **8** patients are in the High Dependency Units (HDU).
