PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of October 27th 2021, a total of **5,153, 667** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,608,290** were

partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,545,377**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **40.6%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **5.7%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **17.2%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **15.1%**, Kiambu **8.9%**, Uasin Gishu with **8.0%**, Nyandarua **7.6%**, Kisumu **7.1%** and Mombasa **6.8%**, while, Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **80** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,188** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.9%**. From the cases **77** are Kenyans except **3** that are foreigners. **40** males and **40** females. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **79** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,018** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,691,330**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Kericho **19**, Nairobi **17**, Bomet **8**, Uasin Gishu **5**, Embu **4**, Nakuru **3**, Busia **2**, West Pokot **2**, Kajiado **2**, Kakamega **2**, Kiambu **2**, Siaya **2**, Nandi **1**, Narok **1**, Nyandarua **1**, Nyeri **1**, Samburu **1**, Tharaka Nithi **1**, Turkana **1**, Bungoma **1**, Kisii **1**, Makueni **1**, Meru **1** and Mombasa **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(1)**, 10-19 years **(7)**, 20-29 years **(24)**, 30-39 **(11)**, 40-49 **(14)**, 50-59 **(6)**, 60 years and above **(17)**.

Today **64** patients have recovered from the disease with **51** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **13** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **246,569** of whom **199,172** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,397** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **4** patients have succumbed to the disease, **one** having occurred in the last 24 hours while the other **three** are late deaths reported after conducting record audits in the months of August, September and October 2021. This now pushes the cumulative deaths to **5,270**. Our sincere condolences to the families and those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(1)**, 60 years and above **(2)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(379)**, 40-49 years **(611)**, 50-59 years **(986)** 60 years and above **(3,057)**.

A total of **467** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,278** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **24** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **12** of whom are on ventilatory support and **12** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **161** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **158** of them in the general wards. **3** patients are in the High Dependency Units (HDU).
