PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of October 28th 2021, a total of **5,226,128** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,642,163** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,583,965**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **41.1%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **5.8%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **17.4%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **15.4%** Kiambu **9.2%**, Uasin Gishu with **8.2%**, Nyandarua **7.8%**, Kisumu **7.2%** and Mombasa **7.0%**, while, Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi county with **33.6%** of its population receiving dose 1 and Marsabit being the least with **1.4%** of the population that has received the first dose only.

On the Covid-19 situation today **133** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,522** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.4%**. From the cases **130** are Kenyans except **3** that are foreigners. **70** are males and **63** females. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **86** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,151** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,696,852**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **40**, Kisii **14**, Busia **14**, Kericho **8**, Nakuru **8**, Meru **7**, Kakamega **4**, Uasin Gishu **4**, Migori **4**, Baringo **3**, Laikipia **3**, Machakos **3**, Garissa **3**, Samburu **2**, Turkana **2**, West Pokot **2**, Narok **2**, Embu **2**, Kiambu **2**, Kisumu **1**, Kwale **1**, Makueni **1**, Nandi **1**, Nyandarua **1** and Bomet **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(4)**, 10-19 years **(7)**, 20-29 years **(23)**, 30-39 **(31)**, 40-49 **(26)**, 50-59 **(14)**, 60 years and above **(28)**.

Today **52** patients have recovered from the disease with **39** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **13** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **246,621** of whom **199,211** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,410** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **3** patients have succumbed to the disease, **all** of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility audit records in October 2021. This now pushes the cumulative deaths to **5,273**. Our sincere condolences to the families and those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(1)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(1)**, 60 years and above **(0)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(380)**, 40-49 years **(612)**, 50-59 years **(987)** 60 years and above **(3,057)**.

A total of **463** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,255** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **24** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **13** of whom are on ventilatory support and **11** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **154** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **152** of them in the general wards. **2** patients are in the High Dependency Units (HDU).
