PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of October 29th 2021, a total of **5,292,312** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,671,133** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,621,179**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **41.7%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **6.0%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **17.7%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri County **15.8%** Kiambu **9.5%**, Uasin Gishu with **8.3%**, Nyandarua **8.1%**, Kisumu **7.4%**, Muranga **7.3%** and Mombasa **7.2%**, while, Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than 1% of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **142** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,950** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.9%**. From the cases **137** are Kenyans except **5** that are foreigners. **110** are males and **32** females. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **82** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,293** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,701,802**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Bungoma **58**, Nairobi **13**, Kericho **8**, Uasin Gishu **8**, Wajir **7**, Nyeri **7**, Garissa **6**, Marsabit **6**, Nakuru **5**, Mandera **4**, Kajiado **3**, Embu **2**, Isiolo **2**, Mombasa **2**, Murang'a **2**, Baringo **2**, Trans Nzoia **1**, Kiambu **1**, Kilifi **1**, West Pokot **1**, Bomet **1**, Busia **1** and Elgeyo Marakwet **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(15)**, 10-19 years **(10)**, 20-29 years **(32)**, 30-39 **(39)**, 40-49 **(17)**, 50-59 **(15)**, 60 years and above **(14)**.

Today **144** patients have recovered from the disease with **133** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **11** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **246,765** of whom **199,344** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,421** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **3** patients have succumbed to the disease, **all** of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the months of September and October 2021. This now pushes the cumulative deaths to **5,276**. Our sincere condolences to the families and those that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(1)**, 60 years and above **(2)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(380)**, 40-49 years **(612)**, 50-59 years **(988)** 60 years and above **(3,059)**.

A total of **463** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,212** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **25** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **13** of whom are on ventilatory support and **12** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **153** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **151** of them in the general wards. **2** patients are in the High Dependency Units (HDU).
