PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of November 11th 2021, a total of **5,893,466** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,861,136**

were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **2,032,330**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **49.2%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **7.5%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **21.6%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **18.9%**, Kiambu **12.2%**, Nyandarua **10.1%**, while Marsabit County is the least county with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi county is on the lead with **35.0%** followed by Nyeri at **30.6%**,

Kirinyaga at **23.0%**, Laikipia **22.4%** and Kiambu **21.1%**.

Marsabit County is the least at **1.4%** followed by Wajir **1.5%**

and Mandera at **1.9%** of the population to have received the first dose of the vaccination.

On the Covid-19 situation today **64** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,790** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.3%**. From the cases **57** are Kenyans while **seven** are foreigners. **38** males and **26** are females. The youngest is a **five-year-old child** while the oldest is **94** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,215** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,761,828**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Meru **10**, Nairobi **9**, Kitui **9**, Turkana **5**, Nakuru **4**, Nandi **4**, Kakamega **3**, Kericho **3**, Kisumu **2**,

Lamu **2**, Mandera **2**, Migori **2**, Mombasa **2**, Uasin Gishu **1**, Laikipia **1**, Vihiga **1**, Garissa **1**, Narok **1**, Nyeri **1** and Kajiado **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(6)**, 10-19 years **(6)**, 20-29 years **(9)**, 30-39 **(12)**, 40-49 **(8)**, 50-59 **(7)**, 60 years and above **(16)**.

Today **47** patients have recovered from the disease with **30** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **17** are from health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,574** of whom **200,001** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,573** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **one** patient has succumbed to the disease in the last 24 hours. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,316**.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(1)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(0)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(385)**, 40-49 years **(616)**, 50-59 years **(994)** 60 years and above **(3,082)**

A total of **396** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,044** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **31** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **15** of whom are on ventilatory support and **16** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **108** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **107** of them are in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
