**PRESS STATEMENT**

**VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of November 15<sup>th</sup> 2021, a total of **6,083,449** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,905,215**

were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **2,178,234**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **52.1%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **8.0%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **22.9%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **19.5%**, Kiambu **13.5%**, Taita Taveta **10.9%**, Laikipia **10.5%** and Nyandarua **10.4%**.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi County is on the lead with **35.3%** followed by Nyeri at **30.8%**, Kirinyaga at **23.2%**, Laikipia **22.7%**, Kiambu **21.4%** and Murang'a at **20.5%**. Marsabit and Wajir County is the least at **1.5%** and Mandera at **1.9%** of the population to have received

the first dose of the vaccination.

On the Covid-19 situation today **75** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **3,854** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.0%**. From the cases **62** are Kenyans while **13** are foreigners. **40** males and **35** are females. The youngest is a **two-year-old child** while the oldest is **94** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,384** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,775,646**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Meru **11**, Turkana **8**, Nairobi **7**, Busia **6**, Garissa **6**, Tharaka Nithi **5**, Kitui **5**, Uasin Gishu **5**, Migori **4**, Kakamega **4**, Embu **3**, Nakuru **3**, Kericho **2**, Kiambu **2**, Narok **1**, Nyeri **1**, Siaya **1** and Taita Taveta **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(4)**, 10-19 years **(5)**, 20-29 years **(15)**, 30-39 **(15)**, 40-49 **(10)**, 50-59 **(8)**, 60 years and above **(18)**.

Today **29** patients have recovered from the disease with **17** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **12** are from health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,711** of whom **200,096** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,615** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **three** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the months of September and November 2021. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,322**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(1)**, 60 years and above **(2)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(616)**, 50-59 years **(995)** 60 years and above **(3,086)**.

A total of **385** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,021** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **23** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **10** of whom are on ventilatory support and **13** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **115** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **112** of them are in the general wards. **Three** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
