PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of November 17th 2021, a total of **6,245,698** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,944,709** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

2,300,989. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **54.8%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **8.4%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**. Total Vaccines received to date are **10,140,210**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is on the lead with **23.8%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri County at **19.8%**, Kiambu **14.3%**, Taita Taveta and Laikipia **11.5%**, Nyandarua **10.9%** and Uasin Gishu **10.1%**.

The table below shows the proportion of those above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi County is on the lead with **35.5%** followed by Nyeri at **31.0%**, Kirinyaga at **23.3%**, Laikipia **23.0%**, Kiambu **21.5%** and Muranga at **20.7%**. Marsabit and Wajir are the least counties with

1.5% and Mandera at **1.9%** of the population having received dose 1 of the vaccine.

On the Covid-19 situation today **88** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,681** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.9%**. From the cases **87** are Kenyans and **one** foreigner. **68** males and **20** are females. The youngest is a **two-year-old child** while the oldest is **84** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,541** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,785,672**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Bungoma **43**, Mombasa **7**, Nairobi **6**, Busia **6**, Kakamega **5**, Makueni **5**, Nakuru **5**, Kericho **3**, Nandi **1**, Narok **1**, Nyeri **1**, Turkana **1**, Uasin Gishu **1**, West Pokot **1**, Baringo **1** and Homa Bay **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(7)**, 10-19 years **(6)**, 20-29 years **(24)**, 30-39 **(22)**, 40-49 **(12)**, 50-59 **(10)**, 60 years and above **(7)**.

Today **26** patients have recovered from the disease with **20** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **6** are from health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,817** of whom **200,160** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,657** are from various health facilities countrywide.

There is no death reported today. Therefore, the cumulative fatalities remain at **5,325**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(616)**, 50-59 years **(996)** 60 years and above **(3,088)**

A total of **364** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **997** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **23** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **10** of whom are on ventilatory support and **13** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **115** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **113** of them are in the general wards. **Two** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
