PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of November 20th 2021, a total of **6,388,427** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,986,501**

were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **2,401,926**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **56.3%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **8.8%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**. Total Vaccines received to date are **10,704, 690**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **24.7%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county **20.2%**, Kiambu **14.9%**, Taita Taveta and Laikipia **12.0%**. Nyandarua **11.3%**, Uasin Gishu **10.6%** and Murang'a **10.3%** and Kirinyaga **10.0%**. Garissa, Wajir, Tana River, Turkana, West Pokot, Mandera and Marsabit counties have less than **2%** of the population fully vaccinated.

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The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi county is on the lead with **35.8%** followed by Nyeri at **31.3%**, Kirinyaga and Laikipia at **23.4%**, Kiambu **21.7%** and Muranga at **20.9%**. Marsabit and Wajir counties are the least with **1.5%**, followed by Mandera County with only **1.9%** of the population receiving dose 1 of the vaccine.

On the Covid-19 situation today **22** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **3,191** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **0.7%**. From the cases **21** are Kenyans while **one** is a foreigner. **14** are females and **8** are males. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **79** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,710** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,798,001**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **8**, Bomet **6**, Bungoma **1**, Kakamega **1**, Kericho **1**, Baringo **1**, Kiambu **1**, Mombasa **1**, Nakuru **1** and Uasin Gishu **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(2)**, 10-19 years **(2)**, 20-29 years **(3)**, 30-39 **(6)**, 40-49 **(3)**, 50-59 **(1)**, 60 years and above **(5)**.

Today **35** patients have recovered from the disease with **25** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **10** are from health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,954** of whom **200,243** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,711** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **3** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting audit reports in the months

of October and November 2021. This pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,328**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends of those have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(3)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(616)**, 50-59 years **(996)** 60 years and above **(3,091)**

A total of **350** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **981** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **20** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **9** of whom are on ventilatory support and **11** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **113** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **111** of them are in the general wards. **Three** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
