PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of November 21st 2021, a total of **6,398,580** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,990,944** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

2,407,636. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **56.4%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **8.8%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**. Total Vaccines received to date are **10,704, 690**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is on the lead with **24.8%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county at **20.2%**, Kiambu **14.9%**, Taita Taveta and Laikipia **12.0%**, Nyandarua **11.3%**, Uasin Gishu **10.6%**, Murang'a **10.3%** and Kirinyaga **10.0%**. Garissa, Wajir, Tana River, Turkana, West Pokot, Mandera and Marsabit counties are the least with less than **2%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of those above 18 years who have received the first Dose of the COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi

county is on the lead with **35.8%** followed by Nyeri at **31.3%**, Kirinyaga **23.5%**, Laikipia at **23.4%**, Kiambu **21.7%** and Muranga at **20.9%**. Marsabit and Wajir counties are the least with **1.5%** followed by Mandera County with **1.9%** of the population having received the 1st dose of the vaccination.

On the Covid-19 situation today **18** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **3,982** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **0.5%**. From the cases **13** are Kenyans while **five** are foreigners. **10** are males and **8** are females. The youngest is **30** years while the oldest is **83** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,728** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,801,983**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **9**, West Pokot **2**, Garissa **1**, Kakamega **1**, Kericho **1**, Kiambu **1**, Kwale **1**, Migori **1** and Turkana **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 years **(0)**, 30-39 **(10)**, 40-49 **(4)**, 50-59 **(1)**, 60 years and above **(3)**.

Today **21** patients have recovered from the disease with **16** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **5** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,975** of whom **200,259** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,716** are from various health facilities countrywide.

There is no death reported today. Therefore, the cumulative fatalities remain at **5,328**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(616)**, 50-59 years **(996)** 60 years and above **(3,091)**

A total of **351** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **977** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **20** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **9** of whom are on ventilatory support and **11** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **112** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **111** of them are in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
