PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of November 24th 2021, a total of **6,700,134** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **4,143,379** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

2,556,755. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **57.2%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **9.4%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **26.1%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county at **20.9%**, Kiambu **15.5%**, Laikipia **13.0%**, Taita Taveta **12.5%**, Nyandarua **11.7%**, Uasin Gishu and Muranga **11.2%**, Kirinyaga **10.6%**, Kisumu **10.3%** and Nakuru **10.1%**. Meanwhile, Turkana, West Pokot, Mandera and Marsabit have less than **2%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi

County is on the lead with **36.8%**, followed by Nyeri at **31.9%**, Laikipia **24.1%**, Kirinyaga **24.0%**, Kiambu **22.4%**, Muranga **21.7%**, Taita Taveta **21.3%** and Nyandarua **20.3%**. Marsabit and Wajir counties are the least with only **1.5%** of the population having received the first dose of the vaccine.

On the Covid-19 situation today **46** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,913** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **0.9%**. From the cases all the **46** are Kenyans. **31** males and **15** are females. The youngest is a **23-year-old** while the oldest is **94** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,862** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,816,173**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **14**, Uasin Gishu **8**, Nakuru **4**, Kisii **4**, Machakos **2**, Kakamega **2**, Meru **2**, Bomet **1**, Busia **1**,

Garissa **1**, Isiolo **1**, Kisumu **1**, Marsabit **1**, Migori **1**, Murang'a **1**, Siaya **1** and Turkana **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 years **(8)**, 30-39 **(7)**, 40-49 **(9)**, 50-59 **(6)**, 60 years and above **(16)**.

Today **52** patients have recovered from the disease with **30** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **22** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **248,070** of whom **200,323** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,747** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **one** patient has succumbed to the disease which is a late death reported after conducting facility record audit in the month of November 2021. This pushes the cumulative fatalities to

5,333. Our sincere condolences to family and friends that have lost their loved one.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(0)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(617)**, 50-59 years **(996)**, 60 years and above **(3,095)**.

A total of **351** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **966** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **17** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **8** of whom are on ventilatory support and **9** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **106** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **all** of them being in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
