**PRESS STATEMENT**

**VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

Following the New Directives and Measures issued, we wish to note an increase in the number of persons presenting themselves for the vaccine which is highly appreciated. For the first time since the

vaccination exercise kicked off, we have recorded the **highest** number of vaccines **administered on a single day**.

As of November 25<sup>th</sup> 2021, we recorded a total of **110,909** vaccines administered on a single day, **64,123** are first doses while **46,786** are second doses. We are happy that more people are presenting themselves for the first dose compared to last week.

We would also like to point out that we have received media reports that there may be some people manipulating the Chanjo system to issue certificates to persons not vaccinated. The Ministry of Health has embarked on investigations into this matter and is warning anyone found culpable will be arrested, face disciplinary action and be charged in court.

We are working with relevant government agencies on this matter that is not **only unethical but criminal** as well. It is important for the public to appreciate that even if you cheat the system you cannot cheat the coronavirus. Without vaccination chances of

contracting the virus and it progressing to severe disease are high which puts one at risk of death.

As of yesterday, a total of **6,811,043** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **4,207,502** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **2,603,541**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **57.2%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **9.6%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of those fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **26.5%**, followed by Nyeri county at **21.1%**, Kiambu **15.7%**, Laikipia **13.3%**, Taita Taveta **12.6%**, Nyandarua **11.8%**, Murang'a **11.5%**, Uasin Gishu **11.3%**, Kirinyaga **10.8%**, Kisumu **10.5%** and Nakuru at **10.1%**. Meanwhile, West

Pokot, Turkana, Mandera and Marsabit counties have with less than **2%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of those above 18 years who have received the first Dose of the COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi county is in the lead with **37.2%**, followed by Nyeri at **32.1%**, Laikipia **24.5%**, Kirinyaga **24.3%**, Kiambu **22.6%**, Murang'a **22.0%**, Taita Taveta **21.8%** and Nyandarua **20.6%**. Marsabit and Wajir are the least counties with only **1.5%** of the population having received the first dose of the vaccine.

On the Covid-19 situation today, **42** people have tested positive for the disease from a sample size of **4,971** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **0.8%**. From the cases **40** are Kenyans while **2** are foreigners. **21** males and **21** are females. The youngest is a **13-year-old child** while the oldest is **95** years. Total

confirmed positive cases are now **254,904** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,821,144**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **11**, Uasin Gishu **5**, Kericho **3**, Kiambu **2**, Makueni **2**, Marsabit **2**, Mombasa **2**, Nakuru **2**, Narok **2**, Tharaka Nithi **2**, Bomet **1**, Embu **1**, Garissa **1**, Kajiado **1**, Kisii **1**, Nyamira **1**, Kisumu **1**, Kitui **1** and Kakamega **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(3)**, 20-29 years **(4)**, 30-39 **(10)**, 40-49 **(13)**, 50-59 **(6)**, 60 years and above **(6)**.

Today **15** patients have recovered from the disease with **13** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **2** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **248,085** of whom **200,336** are from the Home-Based Care and

Isolation program, while **47,749** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Today there is no death reported. Therefore, the cumulative fatalities remain at **5,333**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**58**), 10-19 years (**39**), 20-29 (**142**), 30-39 years (**386**), 40-49 years (**617**), 50-59 years (**996**) 60 years and above (**3,095**)

A total of **358** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **971** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **16** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **7** of whom are on ventilatory support and **9** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.



Another **104** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **all** of them being in the general wards. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
