### **PRESS STATEMENT**

#### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of November 27<sup>th</sup> 2021, a total of **6,939,559** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **4,282,386** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

**2,657,173.** The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **57.3%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **9.8%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033.**

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **27.0%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county at **21.3%**, Kiambu **15.9%**, Laikipia **13.7%**, Taita Taveta **12.8%**, Nyandarua **11.9%**, Murang'a **11.8%**, Uasin Gishu **11.4%**, Kirinyaga **10.9%**, Kisumu **10.8%**, Nakuru **10.5%**, Mombasa **10.4%**, Kajiado **10.1%** and Embu **10.0%**. Meanwhile, West Pokot, Turkana, Mandera and Marsabit have less than **2%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi

County is leading with **37.5%**, followed by Nyeri at **32.3%**, Laikipia **24.7%**, Kirinyaga **24.6%**, Kiambu **22.9%**, Murang'a at **22.3%**, Taita Taveta **22.1%** and Nyandarua **20.8%**. Mandera, Marsabit and Wajir are the least counties with less than **2%** of the population having received the first dose of the vaccine.

On the Covid-19 situation today **11** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,463** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **0.5%**. From the cases **9** are Kenyans while **2** are foreigners. **7** females and **4** are males. The youngest is a **19-year-old** while the oldest is **81** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,951** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,827,102**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nakuru **3**, Murang'a **2**, Nairobi **2**, Wajir **2**, Trans Nzoia **1** and Kericho **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(1)**, 20-29 years **(0)**, 30-39 **(3)**, 40-49 **(1)**, 50-59 **(2)**, 60 years and above **(4)**.

Today **15** patients have recovered from the disease with **8** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **7** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **248,131** of whom **200,372** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,759** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Today there is no death reported. Therefore, the cumulative fatalities remain at **5,333**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(617)**, 50-59 years **(996)** 60 years and above **(3,095)**

A total of **175** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **812** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **5** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **4** of whom are on ventilatory support and **1** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **51** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **all** of them being in the general wards. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
