### **PRESS STATEMENT**

#### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of November 28<sup>th</sup> 2021, a total of **6,959,988** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **4,295,764** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

**2,664,224**. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **57.0%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **9.8%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **27.0%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county at **21.4%**, Kiambu **15.9%**, Laikipia **13.7%**, Taita Taveta **12.8%**, Nyandarua **11.9%**, Murang'a **11.8%**, Uasin Gishu **11.5%** and Kirinyaga **10.9%**, Kisumu **10.8%**, Nakuru **10.5%**, Mombasa **10.4%**, Kajiado **10.2%** and Embu **10.0%**. While West Pokot, Turkana, Mandera and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **2%** of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **28** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,969** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **0.9%**. From the cases **25** are Kenyans while **3** are foreigners. **15** males and **13** are females. The youngest is a **five-year-old child** while the oldest is **85** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **254,979** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,830,071**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Meru **12**, Nairobi **8**, Kakamega **4**, Isiolo **2**, Kiambu **1** and Busia **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(1)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 years **(2)**, 30-39 **(6)**, 40-49 **(5)**, 50-59 **(5)**, 60 years and above **(9)**.

Today **177** patients have recovered from the disease with **154** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **23** are

from health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **248,308** of whom **200,395** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,913** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **one** patient has succumbed to the disease being a late death reported after conducting facility record audit. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5334**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(0)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(1)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(386)**, 40-49 years **(617)**, 50-59 years **(996)** 60 years and above **(3,096)**

A total of **169** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **816** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **7** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **6** of whom are on ventilatory support and **1** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **50** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **all** of them being in the general wards. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
