### **PRESS STATEMENT**

#### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of November 2<sup>nd</sup> 2021, a total of **5,427,617** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,728,033** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

**1,699,584.** The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **42.9%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **6.2%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033.**

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **18.5%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri County **16.3%**, Kiambu **10.0%**, Uasin Gishu with **8.7%**, Nyandarua **8.4%**, Kisumu **7.7%**, Muranga **7.4%** and Mombasa **7.4%**, while Mandera, Wajir, Garissa, and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **103** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **4,617** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.2%**. From the cases **96** are Kenyans except **7** that are foreigners. **53** are males and **50** females. The youngest is a **three-year-old child** while the oldest is **97** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,512** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,718,872**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Kericho **18**, Nairobi **13**, Trans Nzoia **11**, Nyamira **10**, Migori **7**, Siaya **5**, Turkana **5**, Uasin Gishu **5**, Kiambu **4**, Busia **4**, Kisii **3**, Marsabit **2**, Kakamega **2**, West Pokot **2**, Kilifi **1**, Kirinyaga **1**, Kisumu **1**, Kitui **1**, Machakos **1**, Meru **1**, Makueni **1**, Mandera **1**, Mombasa **1**, Murang'a **1**, Garissa **1** and Kajiado **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(6)**, 10-19 years **(6)**, 20-29 years **(23)**, 30-39 **(20)**, 40-49 **(13)**, 50-59 **(10)**, 60 years and above **(25)**.

Today **68** patients have recovered from the disease with **61** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **7** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,025** of whom **199,548** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,477** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Today, there are no deaths reported therefore the cumulative fatalities remain at **5,282**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(38)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(381)**, 40-49 years **(612)**, 50-59 years **(990)** 60 years and above **(3,062)**.

A total of **444** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,175** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **26** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **12** of whom are on ventilatory support and **14** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **130** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **129** of them in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
