**PRESS STATEMENT**

**VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of November 3<sup>rd</sup> 2021, a total of **5,482,089** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,744,710** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,737,379**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **43.6%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **6.4%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with 18.9% of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri County 16.6%, Kiambu 10.2%, Taita Taveta and Uasin Gishu with 8.8%, Nyandarua 8.6%, Kisumu 7.8%, Mombasa 7.6% and Murang'a 7.5%, while, Mandera, Wajir and Marsabit are the least vaccinated counties with less than 1% of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **149** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,500** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.7%**. From the cases **148** are Kenyans except **one** foreigner. **75** females and **74** are males.

The youngest is a **seven-year-old child** while the oldest is **98** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,661** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,724,372**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Kitui **49**, Nairobi **41**, Nakuru **9**, Trans Nzoia **7**, Busia **5**, Kisii **5**, Meru **5**, Isiolo **4**, Makueni **3**, Kakamega **3**, Bomet **2**, Bungoma **2**, Marsabit **2**, Elgeyo Marakwet **1**, Garissa **1**, Kajiado **1**, Kisumu **1**, Migori **1**, Murang'a **1**, Nandi **1**, Narok **1**, Nyandarua **1**, Tharaka Nithi **1**, Uasin Gishu **1** and Wajir **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**1**), 10-19 years (**6**), 20-29 years (**29**), 30-39 (**31**), 40-49 (**29**), 50-59 (**24**), 60 years and above (**29**).

Today **131** patients have recovered from the disease with **103** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **28** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now

stand at **247,156** of whom **199,651** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,505** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **14** patients have succumbed to the disease all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility audit records. This pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,296**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(1)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(3)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(10)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(141)**, 30-39 years **(381)**, 40-49 years **(615)**, 50-59 years **(990)** 60 years and above **(3,072)**.

A total of **426** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,151** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **32** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **18** of whom are on ventilatory support and **14** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **114** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **112** of them in the general wards. **Two** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
