**PRESS STATEMENT**

The Covid-19, vaccine supply in the country has continued to improve. So far, close to 9 million doses have been delivered and we expect the delivery of a further 6 million doses before the end

of the year. The country now has sufficient doses to vaccinate most of our adult population and achieve our 10 million target by Christmas. It is for this reason that the Ministry of Health has opened up access for vaccines for all persons aged 18 years and above, so that they are protected from this unpredictable pandemic. The current reduction in confirmed cases we are witnessing should not deceive us that this pandemic is over. It is not yet over and the reduced number of cases should not be a reason for anyone to disregard the COVID-19 vaccination exercise that the government is offering free of charge. This is the time to take your jab not only for your protection but to ensure that we are collectively vaccinated to attain a herd immunity to fully open up our economy.

### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of November 4<sup>th</sup> 2021, a total of **5,546,979** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,764,767** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,782,212**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **44.5%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **6.5%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with 19.3% of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri county 17.0%, Kiambu 10.6%, Uasin Gishu and Nyandarua 8.9% respectively, Kisumu 7.9%, Mombasa 7.8%, Muranga 7.6%, while, Mandera, Wajir and Marsabit are the least with less than 1% of the population fully vaccinated.

On the Covid-19 situation today **76** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,267** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.2%**. From the cases **71** are Kenyans and **5** foreigners. **42** males and **34** are females. The youngest is a **one-year-old infant** while the oldest is **100** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,737** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,730,639**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **16**, Bomet **9**, Nakuru **8**, Uasin Gishu **8**, Kitui **6**, Busia **3**, Tharaka Nithi **1**, Turkana **3**, Mombasa **3**, Kakamega **3**, Murang'a **2**, Garissa **2**, Kiambu **2**, Marsabit **2**, Migori **1**, Narok **1**, Nyeri **1**, Vihiga **1**, Kajiado **1**, Kisumu **1**, Laikipia **1** and Machakos **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**8**), 10-19 years (**2**), 20-29 years (**14**), 30-39 (**14**), 40-49 (**12**), 50-59 (**7**), 60 years and above (**19**).

Today **46** patients have recovered from the disease with **32** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **14** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,202** of whom **199,683** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,519** are from various health facilities countrywide.

No death has been reported in the last 24 hours. The cumulative fatalities still remain at **5,296**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**58**), 10-19 years (**39**), 20-29 (**141**), 30-39 years (**381**), 40-49 years (**615**), 50-59 years (**990**) 60 years and above (**3,072**).

A total of **422** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,143** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **33** patients are in the Intensive Care

Unit (ICU), **19** of whom are on ventilatory support and **14** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **113** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen with **111** of them in the general wards. **Two** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
