PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of November 8th 2021, a total of **5,691,050** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **3,808,382** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were **1,882,668**.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **46.3%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **6.9%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County in the lead with **20.3%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri County **17.8%**, Kiambu **11.2%**, Taita Taveta **9.4%**, Nyandarua **9.3%**, Uasin Gishu with **9.1%**, Kisumu **8.2%**, Kirinyaga and Mombasa **8.0%** respectively. Mandera, Wajir and Marsabit are the least counties with less than **1%** of the population fully vaccinated.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years who have received the first Dose of COVID-19 Vaccination. Nairobi County is on the lead with **34.7%** followed by Nyeri at **30.3%**,

Kirinyaga at **22.8%**, Laikipia **21.9%**, Kiambu **20.9%** and Muranga at **20.0%**. Marsabit is the least County with **1.4%** followed by Wajir with **1.5%** and Mandera **1.9%** of the population receiving only the first dose of the vaccination.

On the Covid-19 situation today **26** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **1,346** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **1.9%**. From the cases **25** are Kenyans except **one** foreigner. **16** males and **10** are females. The youngest is a **two-year-old child** while the oldest is **85** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **253,879** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,743,182**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **13**, Baringo **2**, Meru **2**, Kericho **2**, Kisii **2**, Elgeyo Marakwet **1**, Kajiado **1**, Kakamega **1**, Lamu **1** and Nakuru **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(5)**, 10-19 years **(4)**, 20-29 years **(2)**, 30-39 **(7)**, 40-49 **(5)**, 50-59 **(1)**, 60 years and above **(2)**.

Today **88** patients have recovered from the disease with **83** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **5** are from health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **247,458** of whom **199,913** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **47,545** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **two** patients have succumbed to the disease all of them being late deaths reported in the months of October and November 2021. This pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,314**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends that have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years **(0)**, 10-19 years **(0)**, 20-29 **(0)**, 30-39 years **(0)**, 40-49 years **(1)**, 50-59 years **(0)**, 60 years and above **(1)**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years **(58)**, 10-19 years **(39)**, 20-29 **(142)**, 30-39 years **(384)**, 40-49 years **(616)**, 50-59 years **(993)** 60 years and above **(3,082)**

A total of **403** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **1,077** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **30** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **15** of whom are on ventilatory support and **15** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is under observation.

Another **113** patients are separately on supplemental oxygen and all of them are in the general wards. **No** patient is in the High

Dependency Unit (HDU).
