PRESS STATEMENT

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of December 12th 2021, a total of **8,189,322** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **4,928,719** were partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated were

3,260,603. The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **57.3%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **12.0%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033.**

The table below shows the total County cumulative trends and proportion of fully vaccinated. Nairobi County is in the lead with **30.4%** of the population fully vaccinated followed by Nyeri at **25.3%**, Kiambu **19.2%**, Laikipia **19.0%**, Murang'a **14.7%**, Uasin Gishu at **14.6%**, Taita Taveta **14.5%**, Kirinyaga **13.7%**, Nyandarua **13.1%**, Nakuru **13.1%**, Kajiado and Kisumu at **12.8%** and Mombasa **12.5%**. Meanwhile, Wajir is among the counties with the least number of population fully vaccinated at **2.7%** and Mandera at **2.4%**.

The table below shows the proportion of the above 18 years' population who have received at least one dose of Covid-19 vaccine (A dose of Johnson and Johnson vaccine and first dose of other vaccines) as at Sunday 12th, December 2021. So far, **5,366,186** persons have received at least one dose, out of the target population of **27,246,033 (19.7%)**.

On the Covid-19 situation today **149** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,280** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **6.5%**. From the cases **143** are Kenyans while **6** are foreigners. **81** females and **68** are males. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **97** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **256,484** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **2,891,893**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **123**, Machakos **13**, Mombasa **3**, Kiambu **2**, Kajiado **1**, Kericho **1**, Kitui **1**, Nakuru **1**, Narok **1**, Taita Taveta **1**, Uasin Gishu **1** and West Pokot **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years (**3**), 10-19 years (**2**), 20-29 years (**34**), 30-39 (**59**), 40-49 (**31**), 50-59 (**6**), 60 years and above (**14**).

Today **36** patients have recovered from the disease, **26** are from various health facilities nationwide while **10** are from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. Total recoveries now stand at **248,551** of whom **200,546** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **48,005** are from various health facilities nationwide.

Sadly, **one** patient has succumbed to the disease, and it is late death reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of November 2021. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,349**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

New deaths by age; 0-9 years (**0**), 10-19 years (**0**), 20-29 (**0**), 30-39 years (**0**), 40-49 years (**0**), 50-59 years (**1**), 60 years and above (**0**).

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**58**), 10-19 years (**39**), 20-29 (**144**), 30-39 years (**386**), 40-49 years (**620**), 50-59 years (**998**), 60 years and above (**3,104**).

A total of **175** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **842** are under the Home-Based

Isolation and Care program. **2** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), and all of them are on ventilatory support.

A total of **46** patients are on supplemental oxygen with **45** of them being in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).
