UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE

PRESS STATEMENT

Today **300** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **6,072** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **4.9%**. From the cases, **274** are Kenyans while **26** are

foreigners. **158** are males and **142** are females. The youngest is a **one-month-old infant** while the oldest is **100** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **320,138** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,183,057**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **103**, Nyamira **83**, Makueni **17**, Nakuru **15**, Uasin Gishu **10**, Kilifi **7**, Mombasa **7**, Nyeri **6**, Migori **5**, Kiambu **4**, Siaya **4**, Busia **3**, Garissa **3**, Kwale **3**, Laikipia **3**, Murang'a **3**, Baringo **2**, Bomet **2**, Bungoma **2**, Elgeyo Marakwet **2**, Kirinyaga **2**, Vihiga **2**, Embu **1**, Kajiado **1**, Kakamega **1**, Kericho **1**, Kisii **1**, Kisumu **1**, Kitui **1**, Nandi **1**, Tharaka Nithi **1**, Trans Nzoia **1**, Turkana **1** and West Pokot **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(30)**, 10-19 years **(17)**, 20-29 years **(42)**, 30-39 **(52)**, 40-49 **(50)**, 50-59 **(38)**, 60 years and above **(71)**.

Today **1,123** patients have recovered from the disease, **1,001** are from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **122** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **289,547** of whom **237,772** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **51,775** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Unfortunately, **3** patients have succumbed to disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of January. Therefore, this pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,531**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**59**), 10-19 years (**42**), 20-29 (**148**), 30-39 years (**398**), 40-49 years (**639**), 50-59 years (**1,012**), 60 years and above (**3,233**).

A total of **814** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **6,801** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **46** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), **44** of them on ventilatory support while **two** are on supplemental oxygen.

Another **199** patients are on supplemental oxygen and **197** of them are in the general wards. **2** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of January 21st 2022, a total of **11,522,950** vaccines had so far been administered across the country. Of these, **6,308,695** are partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated are **5,063,545**. Another **36,703** are doses administered to those between 15 to 18 years while **114,007** are booster doses.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **60.6%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **18.6%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
