## **UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE**

### **MEASURES, AS AT JANUARY 27, 2022**

### **PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **152** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **5,666** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.8%**. From the cases, **131** are Kenyans while **21** are

foreigners. **87** males and **65** are females. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **97** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **320,918** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,206,603**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **54**, Nakuru **16**, Uasin Gishu **14**, Mombasa **10**, Nyeri **8**, Siaya **7**, Migori **6**, Kiambu **6**, Kilifi **6**, Kakamega **5**, Busia **3**, Nandi **3**, West Pokot **3**, Tharaka Nithi **2**, Murang'a **2**, Elgeyo Marakwet, Garissa, Homa Bay, Kericho, Meru, Nyandarua and Vihiga **1** case each.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(8)**, 10-19 years **(9)**, 20-29 years **(23)**, 30-39 **(26)**, 40-49 **(31)**, 50-59 **(14)**, 60 years and above **(41)**.

Today **430** patients have recovered from the disease, **348** are from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **82** are

from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at **293,017** of whom **240,789** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **52,228** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **two** patients have succumbed to disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of January 2022. Therefore, this pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,567**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**61**), 10-19 years (**42**), 20-29 (**148**), 30-39 years (**398**), 40-49 years (**640**), 50-59 years (**1,016**), 60 years and above (**3,262**).

A total of **569** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **5,178** are under the Home-Based

Isolation and Care program. **21** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), all of them are on ventilatory support. Another **141** patients are on supplemental oxygen and **140** of them are in the general wards. **One** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of January 26<sup>th</sup> 2022, a total of **11,784,132** vaccines has been administered across the country. Of these, **6,376,995** are partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated are **5,241,059**. Another **38,929** are doses administered to those between 15 to 18 years while **127,149** are booster doses.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **62.1%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **19.2%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
