## **UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE**

### **MEASURES, AS AT JANUARY 30, 2022**

### **PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **101** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **3,923** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **2.6%**. From the cases, **95** are Kenyans while **6** are

foreigners. **54** are males and **47** are females. The youngest is a **one-year-old child** while the oldest is **99** years. Total confirmed positive cases are now **321,335** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,220,562**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **42**, Nakuru **22**, Uasin Gishu **10**, Kericho **8**, Vihiga **3**, Siaya **2**, Bomet **2**, Homa Bay **2**, Kilifi **2**, Kwale **1**, Machakos **1**, Nyeri **1**, West Pokot **1**, Mombasa **1**, Murang'a **1**, Nandi **1** and Kajiado **1**.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(5)**, 10-19 years **(8)**, 20-29 years **(9)**, 30-39 **(27)**, 40-49 **(18)**, 50-59 **(10)**, 60 years and above **(24)**.

Today **542** patients have recovered from the disease, **432** from the Home-Based Isolation and Care program while **110** are from various health facilities countrywide. Total recoveries now stand at

**294,615** of whom **242,179** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **52,436** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **2** patients have succumbed to the disease, all of them being late deaths reported after conducting facility record audits. Therefore, this pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,580**. Our sincere condolences to the family and friends of those who have lost their loved ones.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**61**), 10-19 years (**42**), 20-29 (**148**), 30-39 years (**399**), 40-49 years (**640**), 50-59 years (**1,018**), 60 years and above (**3,272**).

A total of **452** patients are currently admitted in various health facilities countrywide, while **4,690** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **17** patients are in the Intensive Care

Unit (ICU), and all of them are on ventilatory support. Another **94** patients are on supplemental oxygen and **91** of them are in the general wards. **Three** patients are in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

I would like to commend the good progress made in the vaccination exercise against the COVID -19 pandemic. Since we began the vaccination exercise in March 2021, so far **12 million doses** have been administered, with **20%** of the population being fully vaccinated. The Ministry of Health aims to vaccinate at least **70%** of the population by June 2022.

To accelerate vaccinations, the Ministry is conducting a two-week accelerated mass vaccination campaign, taking place in all the 47 counties as from 28<sup>th</sup> January 2022. We have deployed at least

**3,000 vaccination teams**, in addition to the 3,000 facilities currently conducting the vaccination exercise.

I would also wish to note an increase in the number of persons presenting themselves for the vaccine, which is highly appreciated. For the first time since the vaccination exercise kicked off, close to **200,000** doses were administered this weekend alone, which is a positive trend, considering we have witnessed a slow uptake in previous weekends. I want to thank all the key players for their efforts in ensuring that our people stay safe by getting the vaccine.

I also want to encourage those yet to be vaccinated, to present themselves to the nearest vaccination centers available to them. The fight is not yet over. We need to ensure that we protect ourselves from Covid-19 disease. Tupate Chanjo, Tukae Chonjo!

As of January 29<sup>th</sup> 2022, a total of **12,107,587** vaccines have been administered across the country. Of these, **6,475,154** are partially vaccinated while those fully vaccinated are **5,437,273**. Another **54,094** are doses administered to those between 15 to 18 years while **141,066** are booster doses.

The uptake of the second dose among those who received their first dose was at **63.0%**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **20.0%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
