## **UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE**

### **MEASURES, AS AT JULY 3, 2022**

### **PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **194** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,319** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **8.4%**. From the cases **130** are Kenyans while **64** are foreigners. **98** are females and **96** males. The youngest is a **2-**

**month-old** while the oldest is **97** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **334,443** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,765,620**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **162**, Uasin Gishu **9**, Garissa **6**, Kiambu **4**, Laikipia **4**, Mombasa **2**, Siaya **2**, Bomet, Meru, Nakuru, Nyeri and West Pokot **1** case each.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(14)**, 10-19 years **(8)**, 20-29 years **(46)**, 30-39 **(53)**, 40-49 **(40)** 50-59 **(18)**, 60 years and above **(15)**.

Today, **559** patients have recovered from the disease, **525** are from the Home Based and Isolation Care Program while **34** are from various health facilities countrywide. This pushes the total recoveries to **325,385** of whom **272,133** are from the Home-

Based Care and Isolation program, while **53,252** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **1** patient has succumbed to the disease, which is a late death reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of June 2022. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,656**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends that have lost their loved ones.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**62**), 10-19 years (**44**), 20-29 (**150**), 30-39 years (**410**), 40-49 years (**647**), 50-59 years (**1,029**), 60 years and above (**3,314**).

There are **126** patients currently admitted in our health facilities, while **3,276** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **4** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), all of

whom are on ventilatory support. Another **22** are in the General Wards and are **all** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of July 2<sup>nd</sup> 2022, a total of **18,864,418** vaccines have been administered across the country. Of these, **16,788,424** are doses administered to the adult population (18 years and above). Another **1,546,772** are doses administered to those between 15 to 17 years, **43,210** are below 15 years but above 12 years while **486,012** are booster doses.

The total number of vaccines administered in the last 24 hours is **4,379** while the total number of people fully vaccinated in the last 24 hours is **2,037**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was

**31.9%.** The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
