PRESS STATEMENT

Today **249** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,572** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **9.7%**. From the cases **127** are Kenyans while **122** are foreigners. **223** are females and **26** males. The youngest is a **5-**

month-old while the oldest is **100** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **334,800** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,769,558**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **103**, Siaya **27**, Kiambu **20**, Nakuru **15**, Kilifi **14**, Kericho **8**, Homa Bay **7**, Mombasa **7**, Kisumu **6**, West Pokot **6**, Machakos **5**, Migori **5**, Kitui **4**, Kakamega **3**, Meru **3**, Murang'a **3**, Laikipia **2**, Embu **2**, Uasin Gishu **2**, Garissa **2**, Busia, Kisii, Nyeri, Taita Taveta and Kajiado **1** case each.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(20)**, 10-19 years **(25)**, 20-29 years **(47)**, 30-39 **(59)**, 40-49 **(30)** 50-59 **(26)**, 60 years and above **(42)**.

Today, **248** patients have recovered from the disease, **240** from the Home Based and Isolation Care Program while **8** are from

various health facilities countrywide. This pushes the total recoveries to **325,686** of whom **272,426** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **53,260** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **1** patient has succumbed to the disease, which is a late death reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of July 2022. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,657**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends that have lost their loved ones.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**62**), 10-19 years (**44**), 20-29 (**150**), 30-39 years (**410**), 40-49 years (**647**), 50-59 years (**1,029**), 60 years and above (**3,315**).

There are **134** patients currently admitted in our health facilities, while **2,700** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **4** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), all of whom are on ventilatory support. Another **22** are in the General Wards and are **all** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of July 4th 2022, a total of **18,889,945** vaccines have been administered across the country. Of these, **16,802,871** are doses administered to the adult population (18 years and above). Another **1,549,897** are doses administered to those between 15 to 17 years, **43,535** are below 15 years but above 12 years while **493,642** are booster doses.

The total number of vaccines administered in the last 24 hours is **15,373** while the total number of people fully vaccinated in the last 24 hours is **6,580**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **31.9%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
