PRESS STATEMENT

Today **249** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,118** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **11.8%**. From the cases **227** are Kenyans while **22** are foreigners. **125** are males and **124** females. The youngest is a **5-**

month-old while the oldest is **90** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **335,341** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,774,973**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **75**, Siaya **29**, Kitui **24**, Kericho **17**, Kiambu **17**, Nyeri **14**, Kilifi **11**, Nakuru **11**, Garissa **9**, Meru **6**, Busia **5**, Kajiado **5**, Kisumu **4**, Nyandarua **4**, Murang'a **3**, Uasin Gishu **3**, Kakamega **2**, Laikipia **2**, Mombasa **2**, Tana River **2**, Homa Bay, Kirinyaga, Kwale and Trans Nzoia **1** case each.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(14)**, 10-19 years **(13)**, 20-29 years **(48)**, 30-39 **(56)**, 40-49 **(45)** 50-59 **(26)**, 60 years and above **(47)**.

Today, **852** patients have recovered from the disease, **815** from the Home Based and Isolation Care Program while **37** are from

various health facilities countrywide. This pushes the total recoveries to **326,799** of whom **273,491** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **53,308** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Sadly, **1** patient has succumbed to the disease, which is a late death reported after conducting facility record audits in the month of June 2022. This now pushes the cumulative fatalities to **5,660**. Our sincere condolences to the families and friends that have lost their loved ones.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**62**), 10-19 years (**44**), 20-29 (**150**), 30-39 years (**410**), 40-49 years (**649**), 50-59 years (**1,029**), 60 years and above (**3,316**).

There are **155** patients currently admitted in our health facilities, while **2,727** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **3** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), all of whom are on ventilatory support. Another **13** are in the General Wards and are **all** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:

As of July 6th 2022, a total of **18,930,593** vaccines have been administered across the country. Of these, **16,825,804** are doses administered to the adult population (18 years and above). Another **1,553,282** are doses administered to those between 15 to 17 years, **43,806** are below 15 years but above 12 years while **507,701** are booster doses.

The total number of vaccines administered in the last 24 hours is **18,285** while the total number of people fully vaccinated in the last 24 hours is **9,206**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **32.0%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
