## **UPDATE ON COVID-19 IN THE COUNTRY AND RESPONSE**

### **MEASURES, AS AT JULY 15, 2022**

### **PRESS STATEMENT**

Today **133** people have tested positive for the disease, from a sample size of **2,526** tested in the last 24 hours. The positivity rate is now at **5.3%**. From the cases **111** are Kenyans while **22** are foreigners. **82** are males while **51** are females. The youngest is a

**4-month-old** while the oldest is **92** years old. Total confirmed positive cases are now **336,578** and cumulative tests so far conducted are **3,792,836**.

In terms of **County** distribution; Nairobi **49**, Bungoma **29**, Siaya **10**, Mombasa **8**, Kiambu **7**, Nyandarua **7**, Homa Bay **3**, Kilifi **3**, Murang'a **3**, Bomet **2**, Kisumu **2**, Mandera **2**, Taita Taveta **2**, Kakamega, Kitui, Laikipia, Meru, Nakuru and Uasin Gishu **1** case each.

Distribution of positive cases by age is as follows; 0-9 years **(5)**, 10-19 years **(10)**, 20-29 years **(33)**, 30-39 **(39)**, 40-49 **(20)** 50-59 **(10)**, 60 years and above **(16)**.

Today, **194** patients have recovered from the disease, **190** from the Home Based and Isolation Care Program while **4** are from

various health facilities countrywide. This pushes the total recoveries to **329,316** of whom **275,929** are from the Home-Based Care and Isolation program, while **53,387** are from various health facilities countrywide.

Fortunately, **no** patient has succumbed to the disease therefore the cumulative fatalities remain **5,668**.

Cumulative deaths by age; 0-9 years (**62**), 10-19 years (**44**), 20-29 (**150**), 30-39 years (**411**), 40-49 years (**652**), 50-59 years (**1,029**), 60 years and above (**3,320**).

There are **125** patients currently admitted in our health facilities, while **1,469** are under the Home-Based Isolation and Care program. **3** patients are in the Intensive Care Unit (ICU), all of whom are on ventilatory support. Another **10** are in the General

Wards and are **all** on supplemental oxygen. **No** patient is in the High Dependency Unit (HDU).

### **VACCINATION CAMPAIGN:**

As of July 14<sup>th</sup> 2022, a total of **19,055,991** vaccines have been administered across the country. Of these, **16,897,477** are doses administered to the adult population (18 years and above). Another **1,564,539** are doses administered to those between 15 to 17 years, **44,694** are below 15 years but above 12 years while **549,281** are booster doses.

The total number of vaccines administered in the last 24 hours is **16,183** while the total number of people fully vaccinated in the last 24 hours is **7,255**. Proportion of adults fully vaccinated was **32.2%**. The Government is working towards vaccinating a targeted population of **27,246,033**.
